Architecture, Landscape Architecture move up in rankings

A national poll of practicing architects and architecture firms has ranked Cal Poly's undergraduate architecture program as one of the best in the United States for producing "graduates most prepared for real-world practice." In a separate ranking by landscape architecture firms and public-sector practitioners, Cal Poly's undergraduate landscape architecture program ranked as one of the top 10 in the United States. The survey, conducted by the architecture and engineering journal DesignIntelligence, rated Cal Poly's architecture program third in the nation in a tie with Rice University and up one spot from last year, among Bachelor of Architecture degree programs. Cornell University was ranked first, followed by the University of Texas at Austin.
