Oreggia Foundation makes donation to College of Ag

The Oreggia Family Foundation has donated \$474,000 to the College of Agriculture, adding to earlier gifts by Arden Oreggia of \$425,000. The Oreggia Family Foundation was created by the estate of longtime Salinas Valley dairy rancher and farmer Arden John Oreggia, who passed away in late 2005. Oreggia became familiar with the College of Agriculture, taking a keen interest in its creamery and dairy operations. Thanks to the latest donation, the college will award \$45,000 to the new Wine & Viticulture program in support of enology; \$68,000 toward the Cal Poly Creamery, \$24,000 for discretionary projects; and \$337,000 to purchase new equipment for a variety of departments in the college.

Donation creates Latin American Studies Program

Assistant Professor of Geography James Keese has donated \$10,000 to Cal Poly to create an educational, nonpartisan Latin American Studies Program. He is collaborating with Craig Arceneaux in the Political Science Department to establish the program, designed to support activities related to Latin America. Keese hopes his donation will attract matching funds to support such activities as study-abroad programs, student internships, lecture series, a student-studies club, and travel and research.
