## Gay and Lesbian Activist Glenda Russell to Speak at Cal Poly May 8

SAN LUIS OBISPO -- Gay and lesbian activist Glenda Russell will give a lecture entitled "Generational Cycles in the Gay Community" as part of Cal Poly's Provocative Perspectives series on May 8, at 8 a.m., in the Vista Grande Café, with a free breakfast beginning at 7:30 a.m.

Psychotherapist, educator, and researcher, Russell serves as co-chair for the Society for the Study of Lesbian, Gay, and Bisexual Issues' Public Policy Committee. A fellow of the American Psychological Association, Russell is also author of the books "Voted Out: The Psychological Consequences of Anti-Gay Politics" and "Conversations About Psychology and Sexual Orientation." Currently, she operates a private practice in Boulder, Colo., and teaches at the Metropolitan State College of Denver.
