A Construction Milestone for Center for Science and Mathematics

The Center for Science and Mathematics reached a milestone Sept. 15: placement of the final steel beam completing the framing structure of the six-story building. Gilbane Building Company held a private “Topping Out” ceremony for 200 subcontractors who have brought the project to this point. Also invited were about 100 Cal Poly physics, chemistry and soil science professors who will hold classes in the building. Cal Poly President Jeffrey D. Armstrong and Phil Bailey, dean of the College of Science and Mathematics, spoke to the crowd about how much the center means to the university. Christopher Giese, a Cal Poly alum and Gilbane Building Company Project executive, also spoke. The \$132 million, 197,000-square-foot building was made possible by voter-approved



state education construction bonds and \$20 million in private donations to Cal Poly. The center is set to open in spring 2013.

DigitalCommons@CalPoly Reaches One Million Mark

Cal Poly's digital archive, DigitalCommons@CalPoly, recently marked its millionth download since launching three years ago. The archive, a service of the Robert E. Kennedy Library, is highly ranked among similar open-access sites, including No. 1 in the California State University system. "DigitalCommons reached this milestone in just three years, which demonstrates the high value and interest in Cal Poly student and faculty work," said University Librarian Anna Gold. More than 11,000 items are available, and visitors from more than 160 countries and territories have downloaded material. The millionth download was Cal Poly 2010 graduate Jeffrey Migliore's Computer Engineering senior project, "[RFID Asset Tracking and Digital Check-Out System](#)". Migliore works for Evoknow, Inc., an open-source web technologies company in Sacramento. The Cal Poly community is invited to contribute completed scholarship and university material to DigitalCommons@CalPoly for long-term preservation and worldwide electronic accessibility.



Jack Algeo Inducted into Liquid Feed Hall of Fame

Jack Algeo, professor emeritus and former Animal Science department head, has been inducted into the American Feed Industry Association's Liquid Feed Hall of Fame. The honor was announced at AFIA's Liquid Feed Symposium in Kansas City, Mo. Algeo has had a lifetime of industry experience over a distinguished career, including educator, consultant, researcher and Marine. After teaching at Washington State College and Cal Poly from 1948 to 1954, he served as the director of research and resident nutritionist for Sinton & Brown Company in Santa Maria until 1959, when he started a private consulting and research practice. Algeo has consulted for firms nationally and globally, including firms in Jamaica, El Salvador, Sweden, China and Australia. He returned to Cal Poly in 1985, where he served as Animal Science department head until retiring in 1992.

Fluor Corp. Vice President to Speak on Business Ethics Sept. 22 at Cal Poly





Music Department Announces 2011-12 Event Season

Cal Poly Music Department's new event season, titled "2011-12: Make a Musical Wish!" starts with four vocal events in October. Soprano Patricia Caicedo will present a vocal master class Tuesday, Oct. 11, with Cal Poly students, followed by a recital Thursday, Oct. 13, at which she will sing a collection of folkloric and contemporary art songs from Latin America and Spain. Caicedo is considered one of the world's leading authorities on Latin American art song. She founded Mundo Arts, a company that publishes and distributes Latin American art song, and she runs the Barcelona Festival of Song. Tenor Christopher M. Cock will present a recital Thursday, Oct. 20, and a master class Tuesday, Oct. 25. For the recital, he will sing Franz Schubert's "Winterreise," Op. 89. Cock is director of choral and vocal activities at Valparaiso University (Indiana), holds the Phyllis and Richard Duesenberg Chair in Lutheran Music and is director of the Bach Institute.
