## Jim Daly



Retired Statistics Professor Jim Daly died last weekend after a battle with cancer. Daly began teaching at Cal Poly for the Computer Science and Statistics Department in 1972, serving as the Statistics Coordinator. When the Statistics Department was established in 1984 as a separate entity, Daly was elected its first department chair and served two terms. He returned to full-time teaching in 1990, retired in 2005 and continued teaching in the Faculty Early Retirement Program until 2009. He was preceded in death by his former wife, Joyce Curry-Daly, in whose honor he established the Joyce Curry Scholarship that supports the academic pursuits of worthy statistics majors.
