RESOLUTION IN
RESPONSE TO THE TERRORISTS' ATTACKS
OF SEPTEMBER 11, 2001**

- 1 WHEREAS, The Cal Poly community has been deeply saddened by the tragic events that took place in
2 New York City, Washington D.C., and Pennsylvania on September 11, 2001; and

- 4 WHEREAS, Cal Poly, as an institution of higher education, is expected to take a leadership role in the
5 community as to its response to those events; therefore, be it
6
- 7 RESOLVED: That the Academic Senate of Cal Poly, on behalf of the Cal Poly community, express
8 sympathy and compassion for all those who were affected, either directly or indirectly, by
9 the events of September 11, 2001; and be it further
10
- 11 RESOLVED: That the Academic Senate of Cal Poly commend members of the University community
12 who have participated in the various charitable and memorial activities held in response to
13 those events and encourage others to do likewise; and be it further

- 15 RESOLVED: That the Academic Senate of Cal Poly ask that the Cal Poly community reaffirm its belief
16 and commitment to the principles of justice, reason, tolerance, and understanding; and be
17 it further

- 19 RESOLVED: That the Academic Senate of Cal Poly condemn the harassment, intimidation, or negative
20 stigmatization of any individual or group of individuals because of those events, and ask
21 that the Administration take timely action to prevent such acts from occurring and respond
22 appropriately if any such acts do take place at Cal Poly; and be it further

- 24 RESOLVED: That the Cal Poly community urge that any response to the September 11, 2001 events be
25 carried out only by the appropriate authorities and done so with carefully measured actions
26 restricted to punish only those responsible for perpetrating this tragedy.
