## National Endowment for the Arts Awards Cal Poly Arts \$25,000 Grant for La Guitarra California Festival

SAN LUIS OBISPO, CALIFORNIA – Rocco Landesman, Chairman of the National Endowment for the Arts, recently announced that Cal Poly Arts has been recommended for a grant of \$25,000 to support the 2011 La Guitarra California Festival, a three-day Festival that celebrates all aspects of guitar artistry: concerts at the Performing Arts Center/SLO and the Spanos Theatre, various workshops, a free lecture, luthier exhibits, and the Forderer Rare Guitar collection.

The Festival runs from September 9 through 11, 2011 and features over 20 artists in concert, such as Pepe Romero and the SF Guitar Quartet, and a special guest lecture by Central Coast maestro Dr. Craig Russell.

Cal Poly Arts is one of 1,145 not-for-profit national, regional, state, and local organizations recommended for a grant as part of the federal agency's second round of fiscal year 2011 grants. In total, the Arts Endowment will distribute more than \$88 million to support projects nationwide.
