Cal Poly Fifth-Year Architecture Students to Exhibit Design Projects May 25-27

SAN LUIS OBISPO – As a bookend to a rigorous yearlong fifth-year architecture curriculum, Cal Poly design students will showcase the culmination of their thesis studies at the annual Chumash Show from Friday through Sunday, May 25-27 in Chumash Auditorium in the University Union.

Titled “Unfold,” the show will open with a reception from 5 to 9 p.m. Friday, May 25. The exhibit is free and open to the public from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday and Sunday.

The exhibit, now in its ninth year, is an opportunity for this year’s graduating architecture students to display their collective work to the community, fellow students, family, alumni, prospective employers and supporters of Cal Poly’s College of Architecture and Environmental Design. The event is organized by a committee of fifth-year architecture students with support from the college and the Architecture Department faculty.

This year’s collection of work includes designs ranging from the pragmatic to the more theoretical. They vary in scale and typology and will be exhibited in a variety of formats including large-scale models, digital renderings, written theory books and hand drawings.
