Cal Poly Music Department Announces 2012-13 Events

SAN LUIS OBISPO – Cal Poly Music Department's new event season gets under way with a faculty recital in September.

Mezzo-soprano Jacalyn Kreitzer will be joined by Gabrielle Castriotta, oboe; Paul Severtson, viola; and Susan Azaret Davies, piano in a recital titled "Celebrated Classics" at 8 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 29, in the Spanos Theatre. On the program will be works by Giovanni Paisiello, Christoph Willibald Gluck, Camille Saint-Saëns, Antonio Caldara, Joseph Cantaloube, John Corigliano, and Johannes Brahms.

Tickets to the Sept. 29 faculty recital are \$12 for the public and \$9 for senior citizens and students. New pricing includes all Performing Arts Center fees, and event parking is now sponsored by the PAC.
