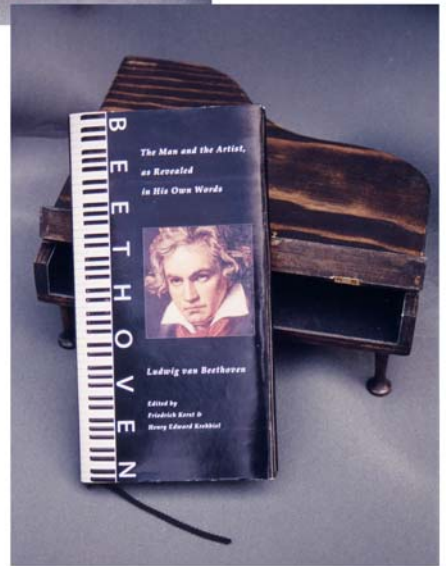

Hilary designed and produced the limited edition of *Once Upon a Time*, her own compilation of favorite fairy tales. The hand-bound book was covered in purple velvet. The front cover was embossed with jewels in the shape of a tiara. It was enclosed in a wooden box lined with satin and trimmed with ribbon. The text of the book was formatted into sections with illustrations throughout.
