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## Milestones, Cal Poly Historical Facts

<b>1901</b>	Legislation founding the California Polytechnic School signed into law.
<b>1902</b>	Leroy Anderson appointed first director of Cal Poly.
<b>1903</b>	First classes held with a total enrollment of 15 women and men.
<b>1929</b>	Legislation passed limiting enrollment to men only.
<b>1933</b>	Julian A. McPhee, Chief of the Bureau of Agricultural Education, appointed Cal Poly President, moving the Bureau headquarters to Cal Poly.
<b>1936</b>	Third year of instruction added to make Cal Poly a technical school.
<b>1937</b>	Cal Poly renamed California State Polytechnic School by the California State Legislature.
<b>1940</b>	State Board of Education authorized granting of Bachelor of Science degrees upon completion of fourth year and changed School to College.
<b>1940</b>	Cal Poly Corporation incorporated (formerly Cal Poly Foundation).
<b>1942</b>	In June, the first BS degrees awarded to 24 men.
<b>1943 to 1946</b>	During World War II, military training contracts brought two Navy programs to the campus: Naval Flight Preparatory School and Naval Academic Refresher Unit Program. Civilian enrollment drops to 80.
<b>1947</b>	Legislation passed officially changing all Education Code references to Cal Poly from School to College.
<b>1956</b>	Women students again admitted to Cal Poly.
<b>1961</b>	On July 1, control over 17 state colleges changed from the State Board of Education to the newly created State Board of Trustees.
<b>1966</b>	President McPhee retired after 33 years as Chief Executive Officer.
<b>1967</b>	Robert E. Kennedy appointed Cal Poly President.
<b>1972</b>	Renamed California Polytechnic State University, San Luis Obispo.
<b>1979</b>	Warren J. Baker appointed Cal Poly President.
<b>1994</b>	On July 1, Cal Poly moved to NCAA Division I following passage of a student referendum in November 1991.
<b>1996</b>	Cal Poly Plan implemented.
<b>2001</b>	New Cal Poly Master Plan approved by California State University Board of Trustees.
<b>2002</b>	Students approve college-based fees to support education quality.
<b>2006</b>	Cal Poly Foundation established as philanthropic arm of the university.
<b>2010</b>	President Warren J. Baker retires after 31 years; Robert Glidden is named interim Cal Poly President.
<b>2011</b>	Jeffrey D. Armstrong appointed 9th permanent Cal Poly President.
<b>2011</b>	Due to state budget cuts, state funds for Cal Poly drop below 50 percent of total resources for the first time in Cal Poly's history.
<b>2014</b>	For 21st straight year, rated best public-master's university in the West by U.S. News & World Report.

## Vision Statement

Cal Poly will be the nation's premier comprehensive polytechnic university, an innovative institution that develops and inspires whole-system thinkers to serve California and help solve global challenges.

## Cal Poly's Mission Statement

Cal Poly fosters teaching, scholarship, and service in a Learn by Doing environment in which students, staff, and faculty are partners in discovery. As a polytechnic university, Cal Poly promotes the application of theory to practice. As a comprehensive institution, Cal Poly provides a balanced education in the arts, sciences, and technology, while encouraging cross-disciplinary and cocurricular experiences. As an academic community, Cal Poly values free inquiry, cultural and intellectual diversity, mutual respect, civic engagement, and social and environmental responsibility.

## Statement of Purpose

When the legislature established Cal Poly in 1901, it acknowledged the need for varied educational opportunities and outlined special goals for this institution. Those special goals were reaffirmed by the Trustees of the California State University and Colleges and the Legislature in 1961, when Cal Poly's enabling act was revised and reenacted.

Certain functions of the California Polytechnic State University are held in common with all California State University campuses, while others are unique to Cal Poly. "The primary function is the provision of undergraduate instruction and graduate instruction through the master's degree (Education Code 66608). In addition to the functions provided by Section 66608, the California Polytechnic State University shall be authorized to emphasize the applied fields of agriculture, engineering, business, home economics, and other occupational and professional fields" (Education Code 90404).

Cal Poly's primary focus is helping students succeed, defined as an expectation that students admitted to Cal Poly should make timely progress to earning their degrees. Cal Poly's faculty and staff are focused on helping students complete their degrees through active advising of students and through the nurturing of student-faculty interactions in the classroom, laboratories, and cocurricular activities.

In addition, Cal Poly is committed to student success and excellence in all areas of education. Cal Poly emphasizes a complete education that teaches students to think logically, evaluate critically, and communicate clearly. Instruction incorporates the ideals of a good work ethic, honesty, and the acceptance of individual differences. The university promotes an effective education that will be a foundation for lifelong learning.

Cal Poly undergraduate students identify their majors from the beginning of their Cal Poly careers. Students select majors at the time they apply for admission, and they take courses in their majors starting in their first year. This affords students the opportunity to decide early if they have chosen a field that is appropriate to their interests and abilities. It also helps students associate with faculty and other students in their field, share common interests, and learn in a supportive atmosphere.

## Learn by Doing

Learn by Doing has been the cornerstone of a Cal Poly education since its inception. Over the past century, Cal Poly has evolved from a vocational school into a premier comprehensive polytechnic university, with its special hands-on teaching approach at the core of the curriculum. Classes emphasize active-learning methods and include a high proportion of laboratory and field work. Activities both on and off campus provide opportunities to apply classroom theory to real-world situations. All these aspects are contained in the working definition of Learn by Doing, which the Academic Senate adopted in April 2011: "At Cal Poly, Learn by Doing is a deliberate process whereby students, from day one, acquire knowledge and skills through active engagement and self-reflection inside the classroom and beyond it."



## University Plans

### The Cal Poly Strategic Plan

Since 2012, Cal Poly has been in the process of implementing a Strategic Plan, which received final campus approval in 2011. Four key principles guide this plan:

- Enhancing student success
- Enriching Learn by Doing opportunities
- Achieving excellence through continuous improvement
- Functioning as a comprehensive polytechnic university

The plan focuses six strategic imperatives:

- Developing and inspiring whole-system thinkers
- Embracing the teacher-scholar model
- Fostering diversity and cultural competency in a global context
- Promoting a culture of support, philanthropy, and community engagement
- Achieving sustainable growth and supporting world-class facilities and equipment
- Ensuring the university's financial future

### Cal Poly Master Plan Update

Cal Poly is in the process of creating an updated campus Master Plan. This plan will guide the long-term development of campus facilities to ensure the university is keeping pace with growing enrollment and evolving academic and cocurricular needs. ## University Accreditation

Since 1951, Cal Poly has been fully accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC, 985 Atlantic Avenue, Suite 100, Alameda, California 94501, telephone 510-748-9001). To reaffirm its accreditation, the university conducted a two-part self-study titled "Our Polytechnic Identity in the 21st Century," which focused on the themes of Learn by Doing, the Teacher-Scholar Model, and Integration and Student Learning. After the last site visit in spring 2012, the WASC Commission commended the university "for an impressive increase in six-year graduation rates from 65 percent for the 1996 cohort to 76 percent for the 2005 cohort." The commission emphasized two areas for further attention and development: "promoting diversity and inclusive excellence" as well as "assessing and improving undergraduate learning." Finally, the commission took action to reaffirm the university's accreditation for the maximum period of ten years, while requesting an interim progress report in 2015 and scheduling the next comprehensive review for 2022. ## Administrative Organization

### Four Administrative Divisions

The university is organized administratively into four divisions: Academic Affairs, Student Affairs, Administration and Finance, and University Advancement. The academic division is organized into six colleges, each with its own dean. Academic Affairs also includes Programs and Planning; Academic Personnel; Systems and Resources; Information Services; Admissions, Recruitment and Financial Aid; International, Graduate and Extended Education; and Research and Economic Development. 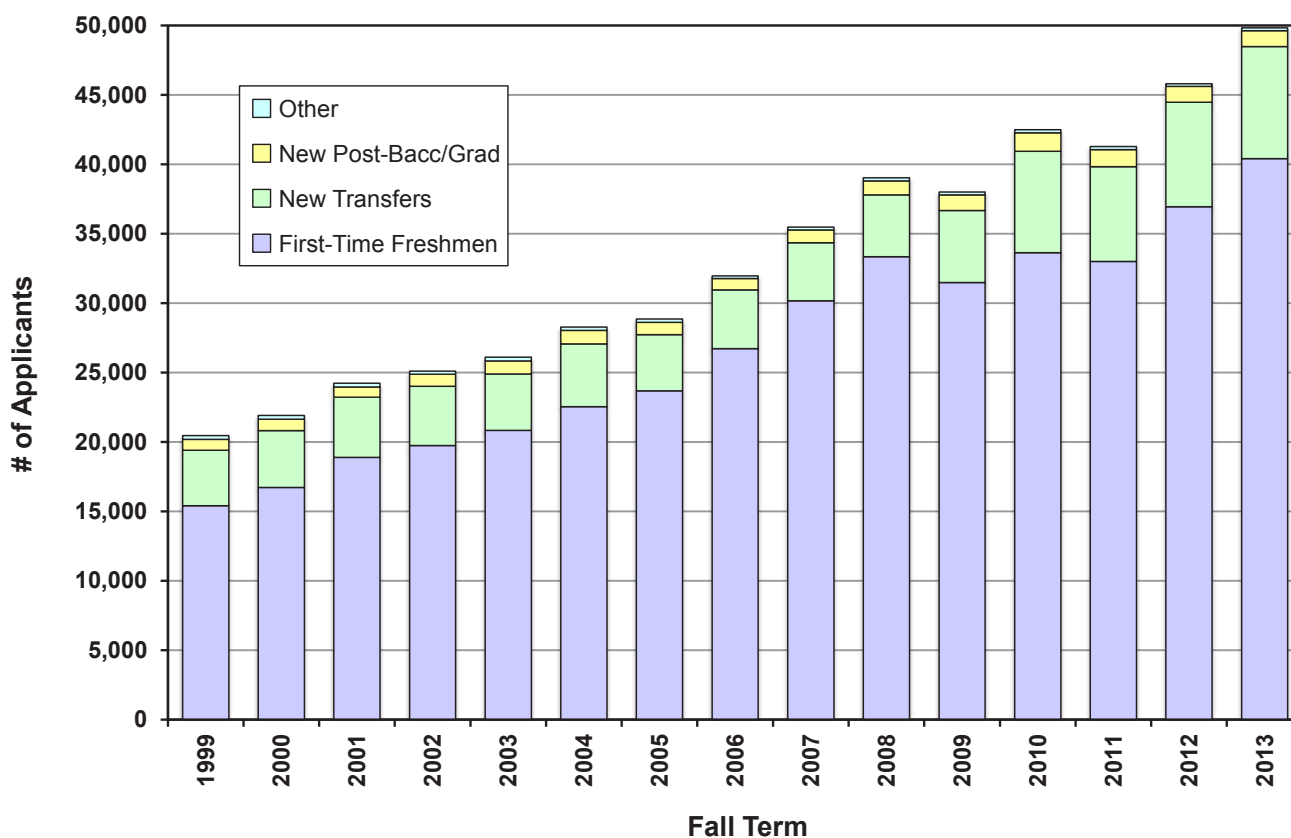
## Admissions Profile

A total of 49,832 applications were submitted for admission in fall 2013. This represents, thus far, the largest number of applicants in Cal Poly's history.

Compared to fall 2012, there was an increase of 4,036 (8.8%) for the total number of applicants; 3,461 (9.4%) for First-Time Freshmen; 548 (7.3%) for New Transfers; 11 (1%) for New Post-Baccalaureate/Graduate (PB/Grad); and 16 (8.65%) for Other.

Taking into consideration the percentage increase for each category, First-Time Freshmen had the largest increase compared to fall 2012, while New Post-Baccalaureate/Graduate had the lowest percentage increase. New Transfer applications have doubled over the last 15 years.

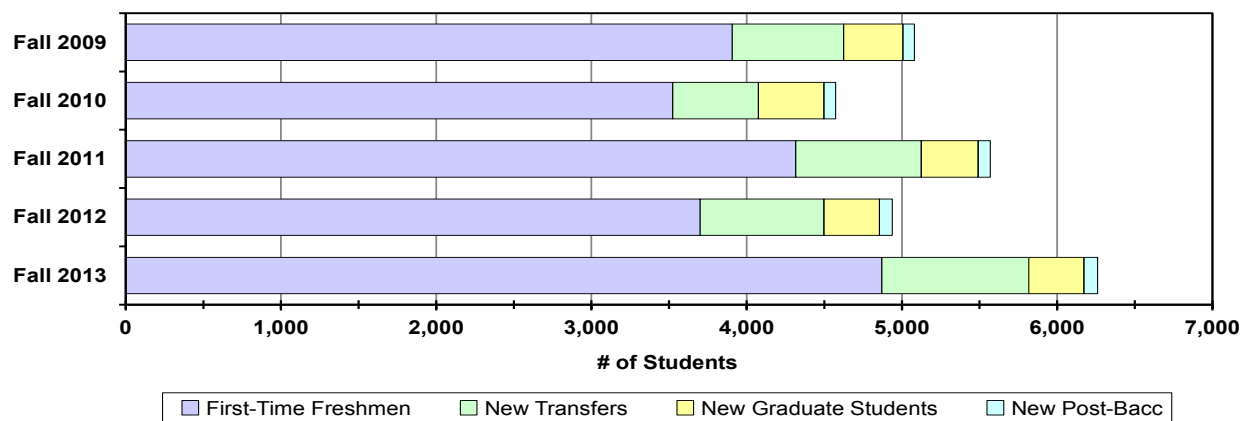

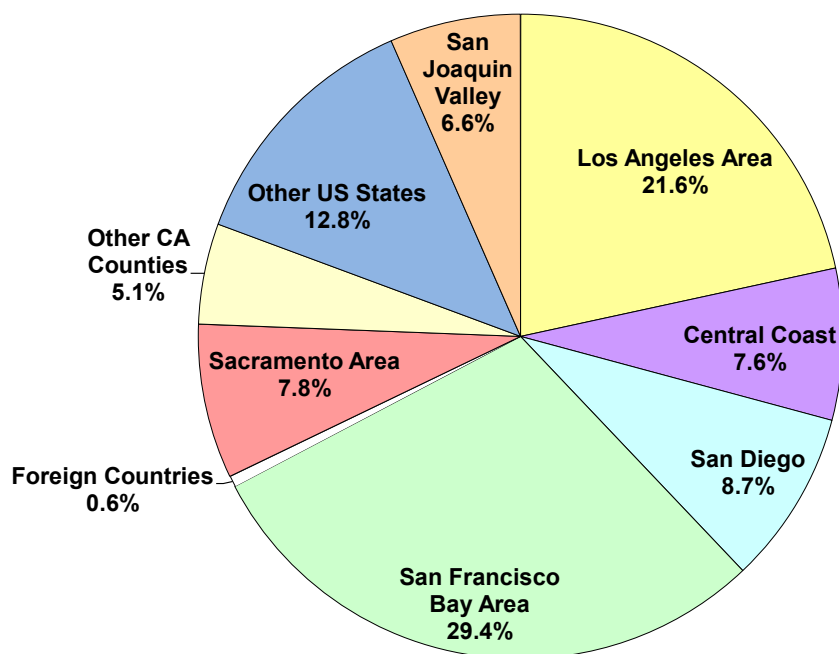

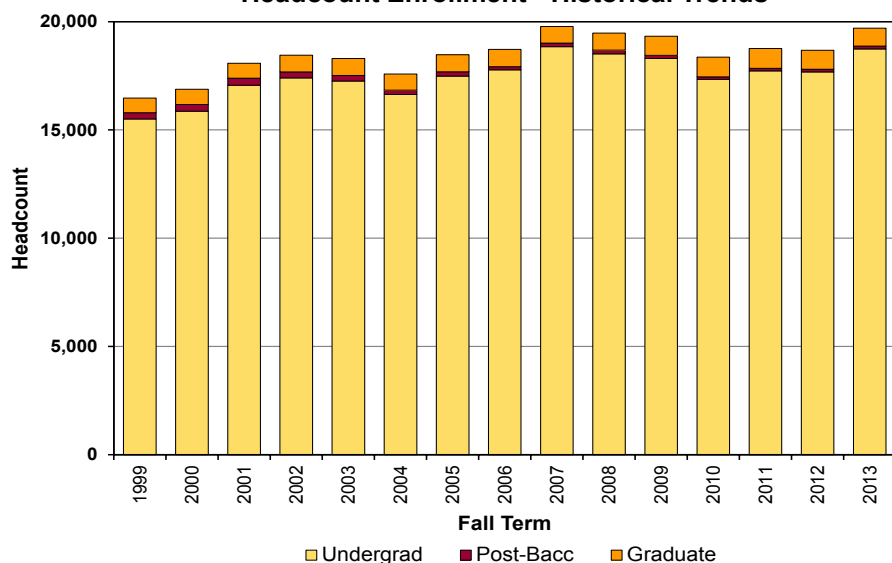

### Headcount Enrollment - Historical Trends



Cal Poly's final headcount enrollment in fall 2013 totaled 19,703 students, which represents an increase of 1,024 (5.5%) from fall 2012.

Compared to fall 2012, Undergraduate headcount enrollment and Post-Baccalaureate headcount enrollment increased by 1,059 (6.0%) and 10 (8.1%) respectively, while Graduate headcount enrollment decreased by 45 (5.1%).

**Notes:** Post-baccalaureate category consists of credential and non-degree-seeking students. Graduate category consists of students who are pursuing master's degrees.

Average student credit unit load for fall 2013 shifted slightly for all categories as compared to fall 2012.

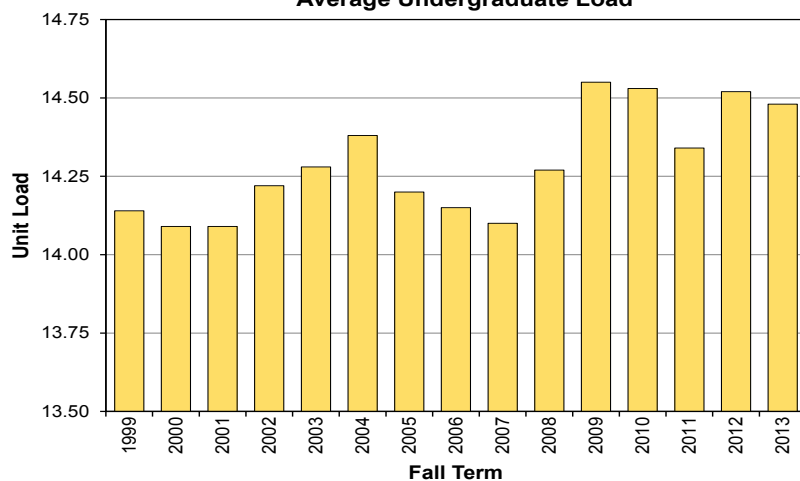
As such, Undergraduate average unit load shifted from 14.52 to 14.48 (0.3%).

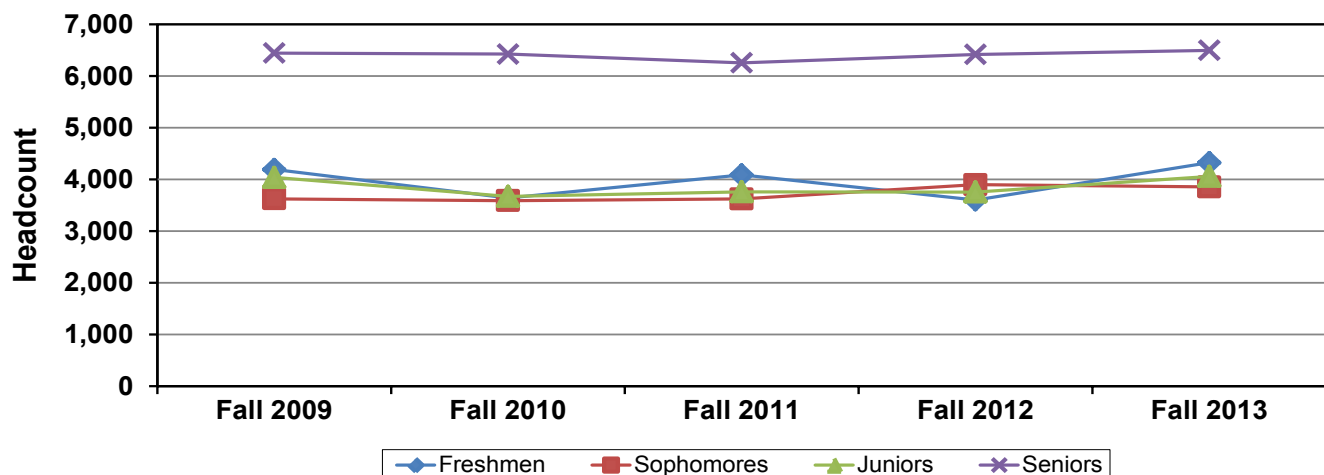

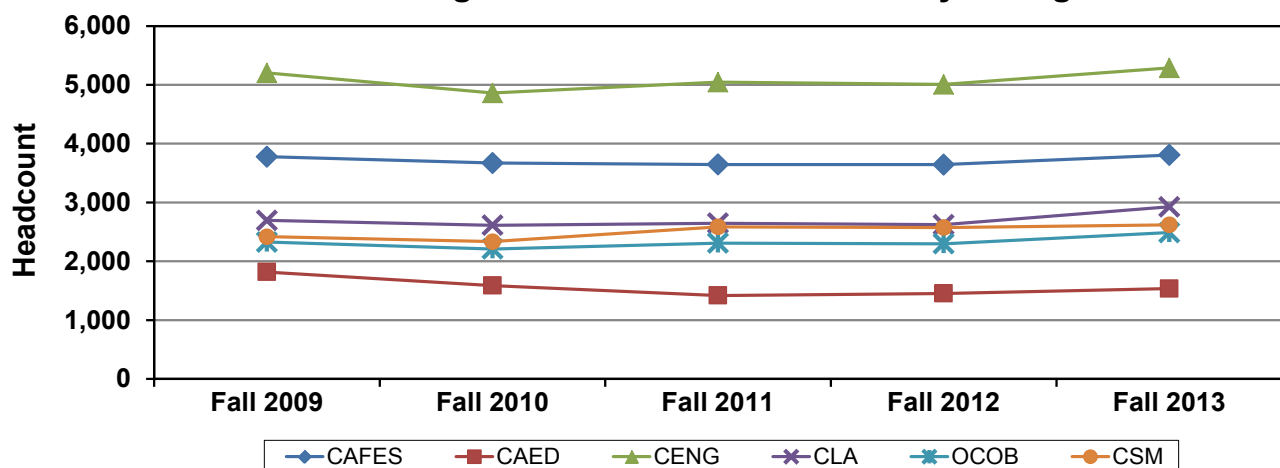

## Degrees Awarded Profile

The total number of degrees awarded for college year 2012-13 was 4,542. This constitutes an increase of 0.6% as compared to college year 2011-12.

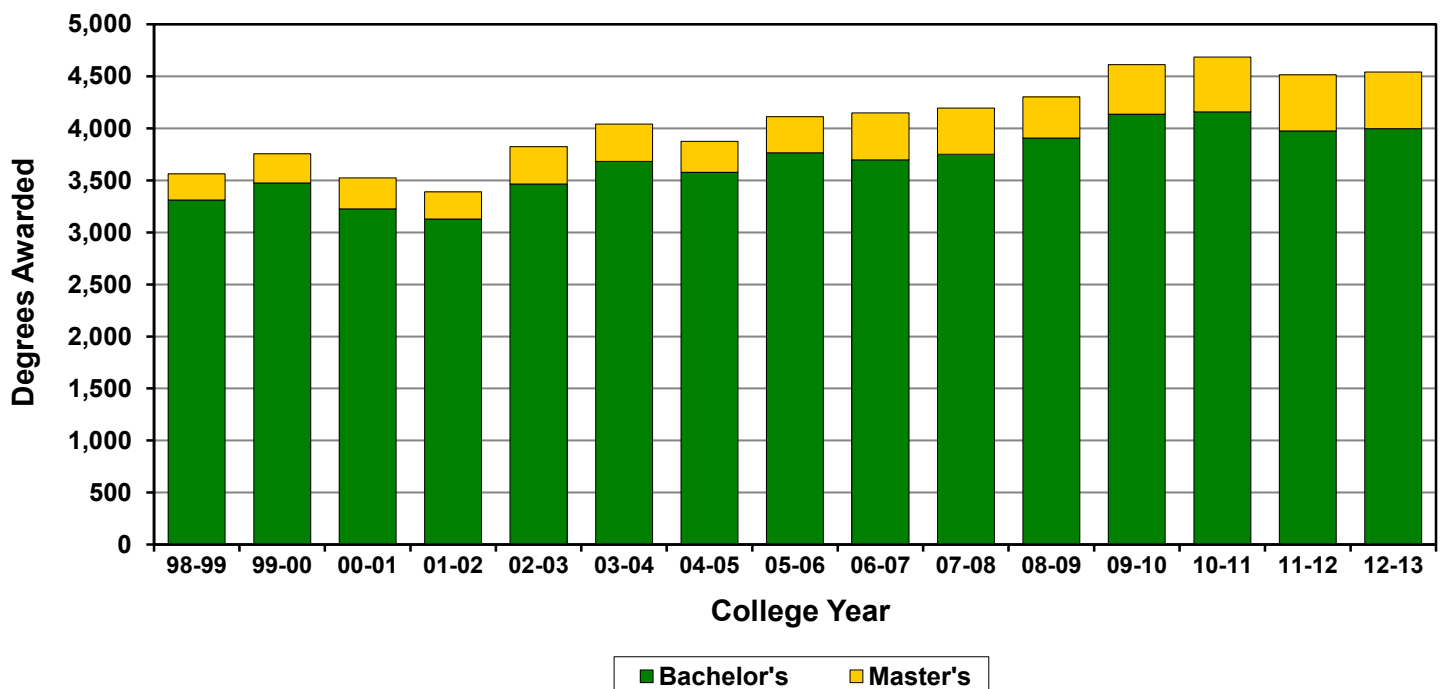
For Bachelor's degrees, Cal Poly awarded 3,997 degrees in college year 2012-13, which represents a 0.6% increase as compared to college year 2011-12.

For Master's degrees, Cal Poly awarded 545 degrees in college year 2012-13, which represents a 0.7% increase as compared to college year 2011-12.

### Notes:

- A college year consists of all four academic quarters, with the summer quarter as a lead quarter (e.g., summer 2012 is part of college year 2012-13).
- Institutional Research now reports degrees awarded based on the students' actual term of completion rather than the date the degree was posted, as was done in earlier publications. While this allows for more accurate reporting of actual completion as well as more appropriate graduation rate reporting, these figures may change in future publications because degrees can be posted for students retroactively.
- Degrees awarded is not an unduplicated headcount. Students who receive more than one degree are counted for each degree they receive.

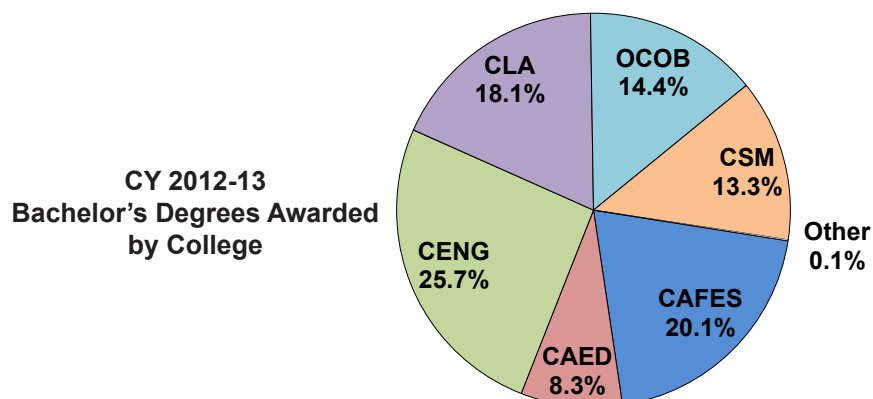

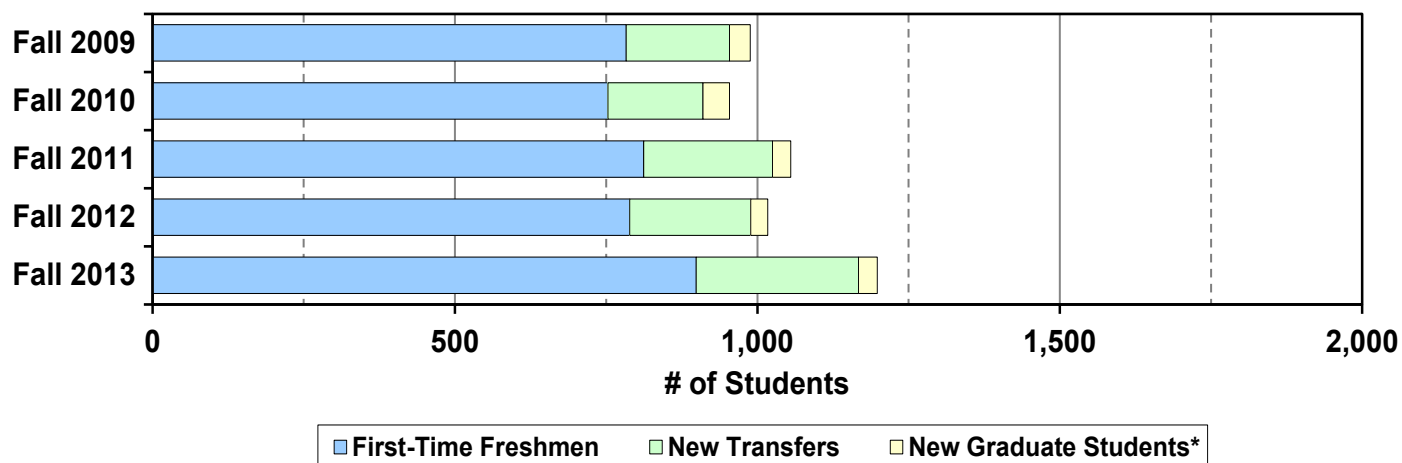

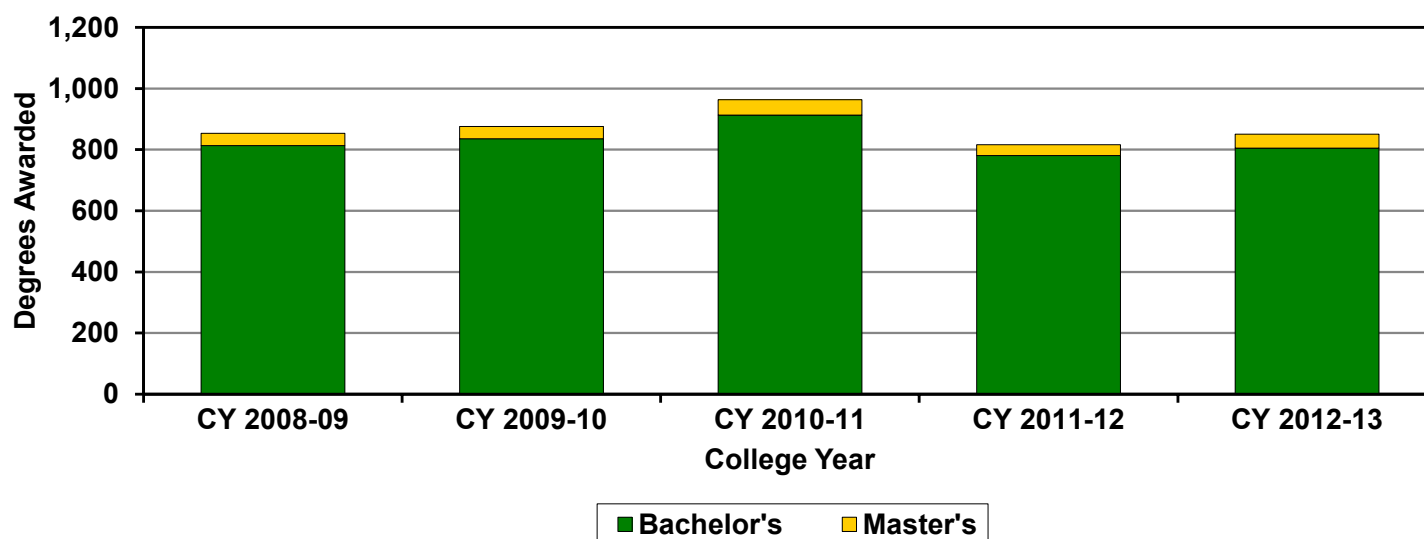

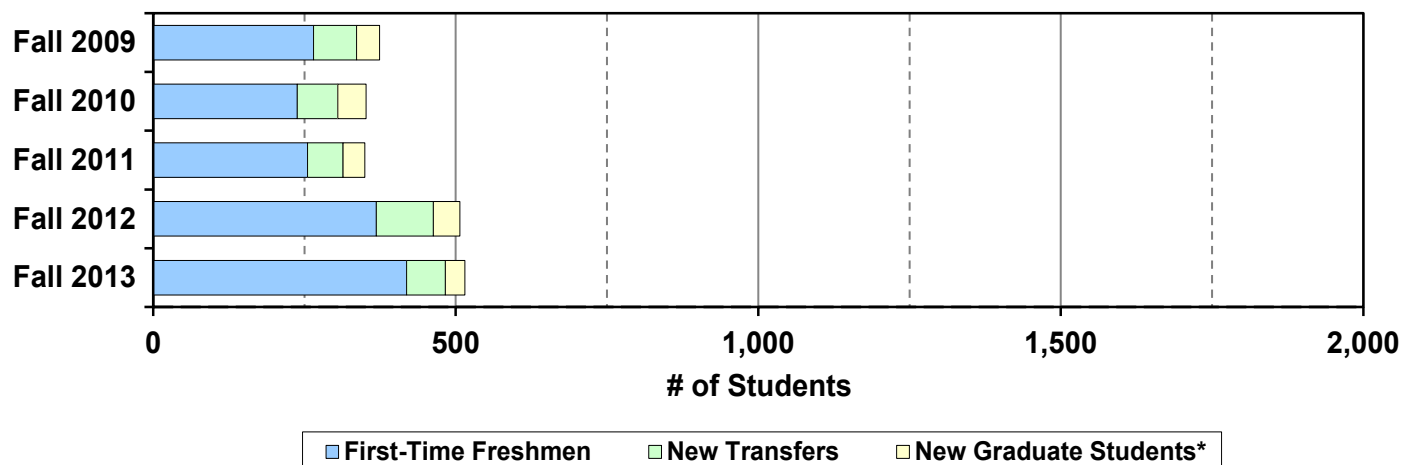

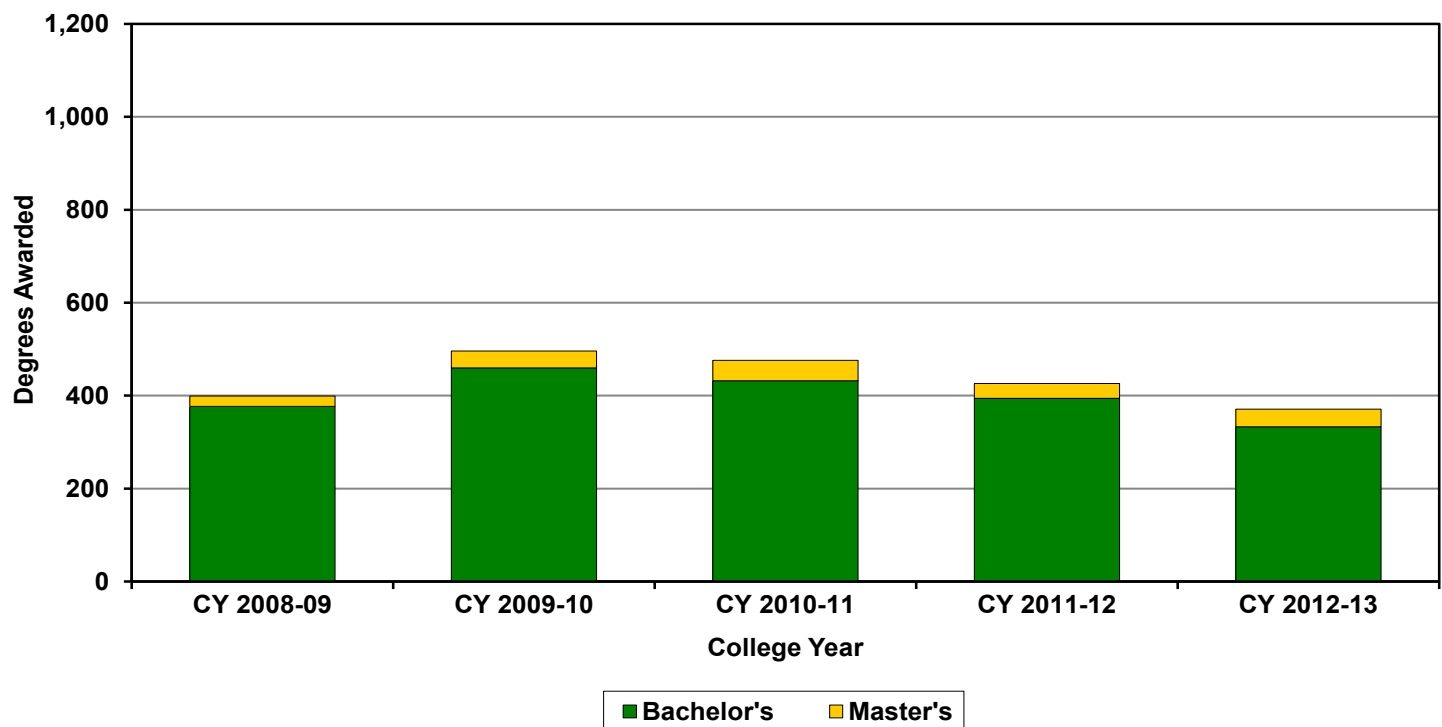

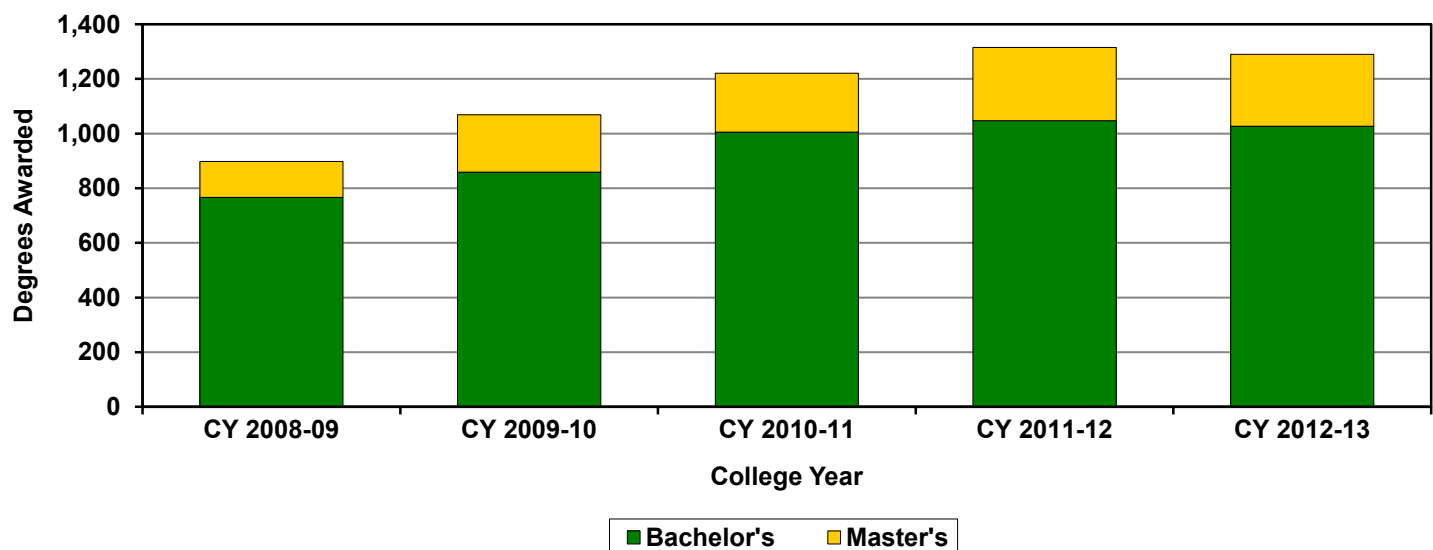

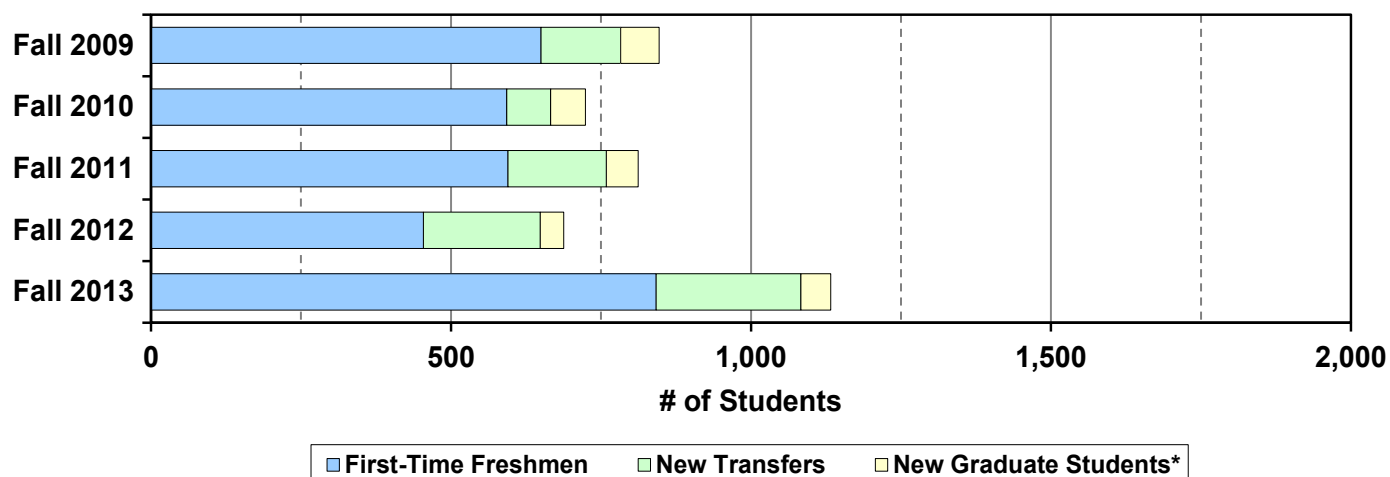

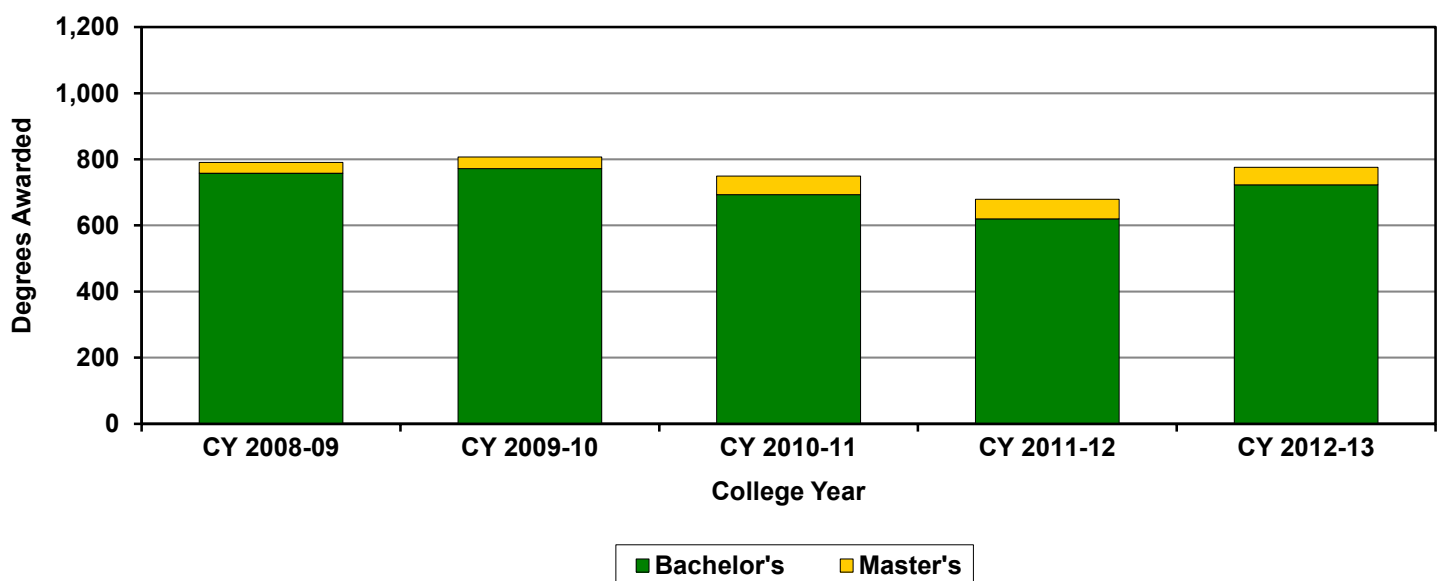

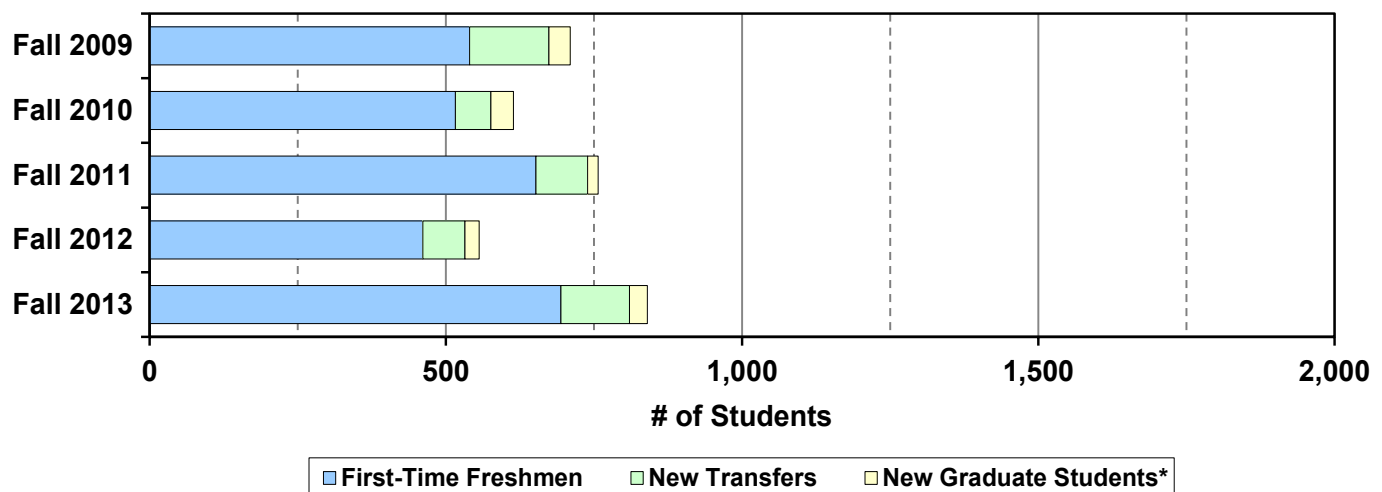

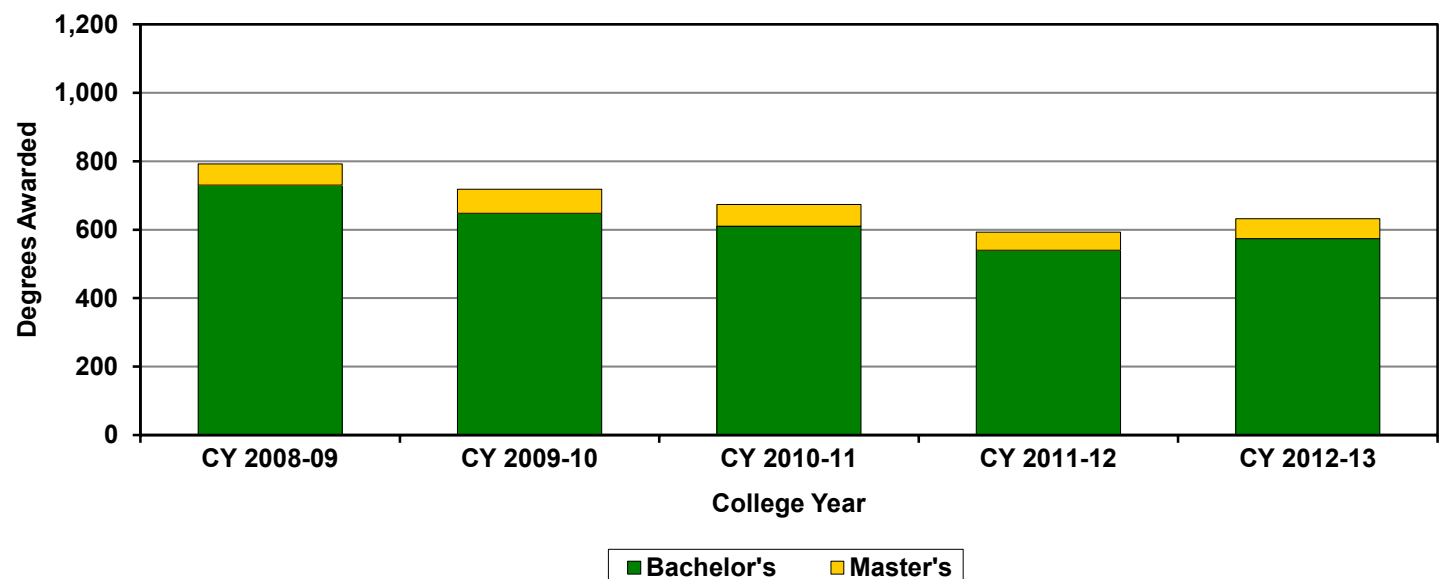

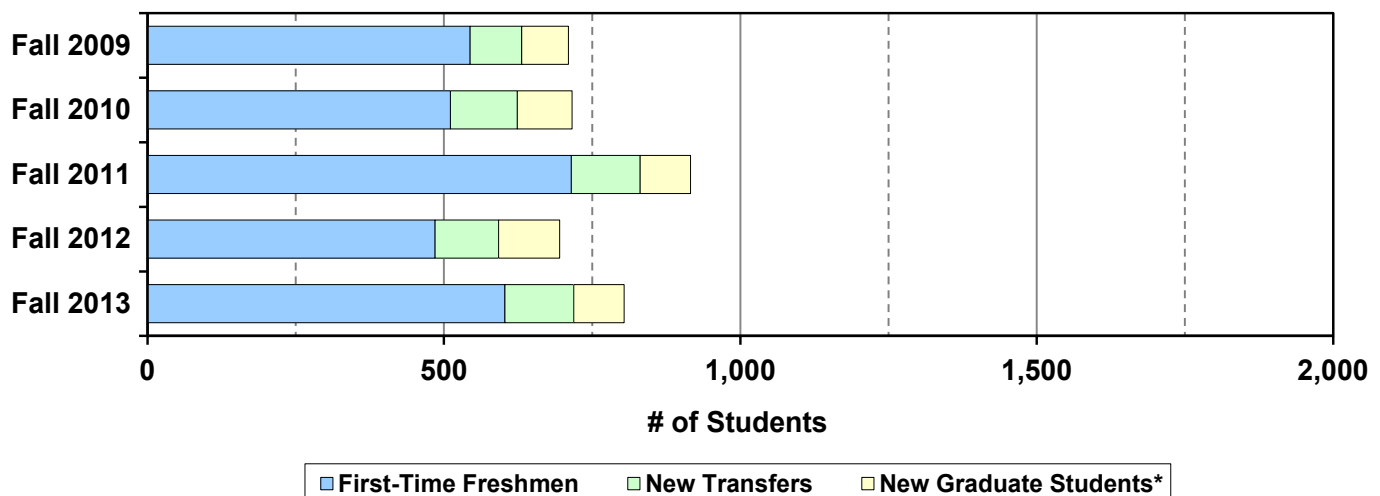

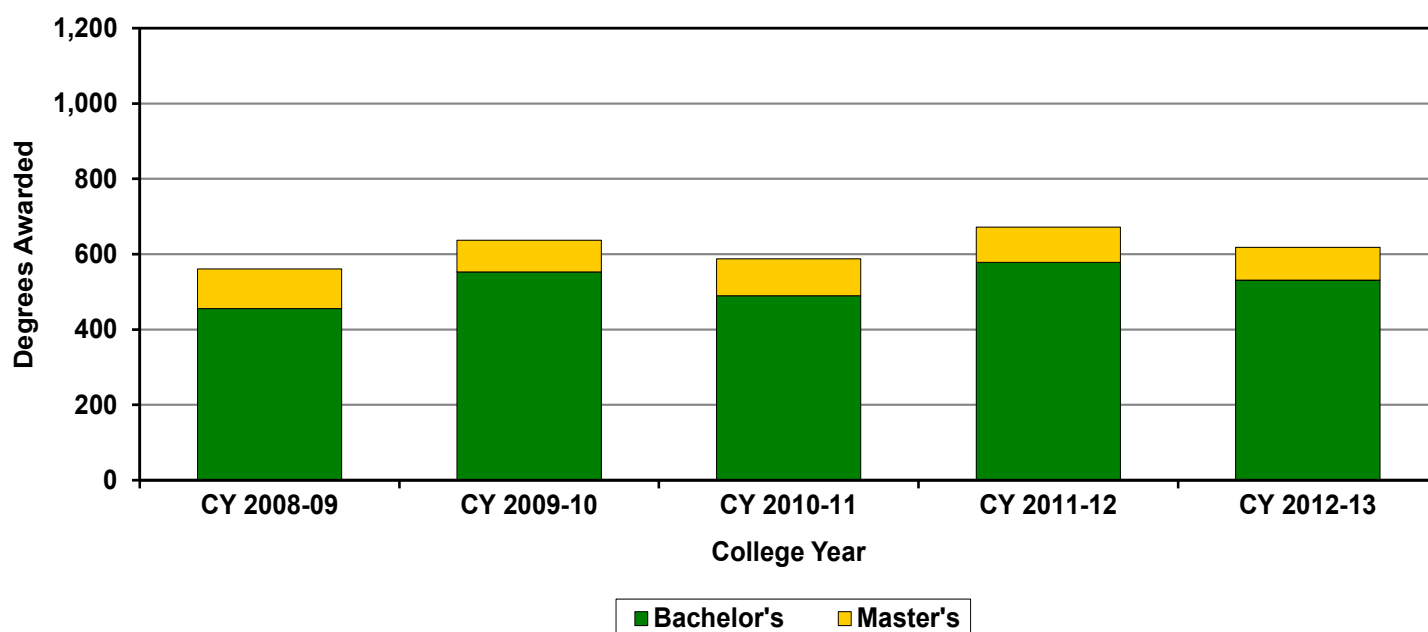

## Employee Profile

In fall 2013 Cal Poly had a total of 2,741 employees, generating 2,205.3 paid FTE (full-time equivalent). There were 1,293 staff, 185 management, and 1,263 faculty. Fall 2013 faculty generated 996.2 instructional FTE.

Faculty and staff make up 93.3% of Cal Poly employees (46.1% and 47.2% respectively).

Academic Affairs is the division with the majority of employees, with 69.4% of total employees.

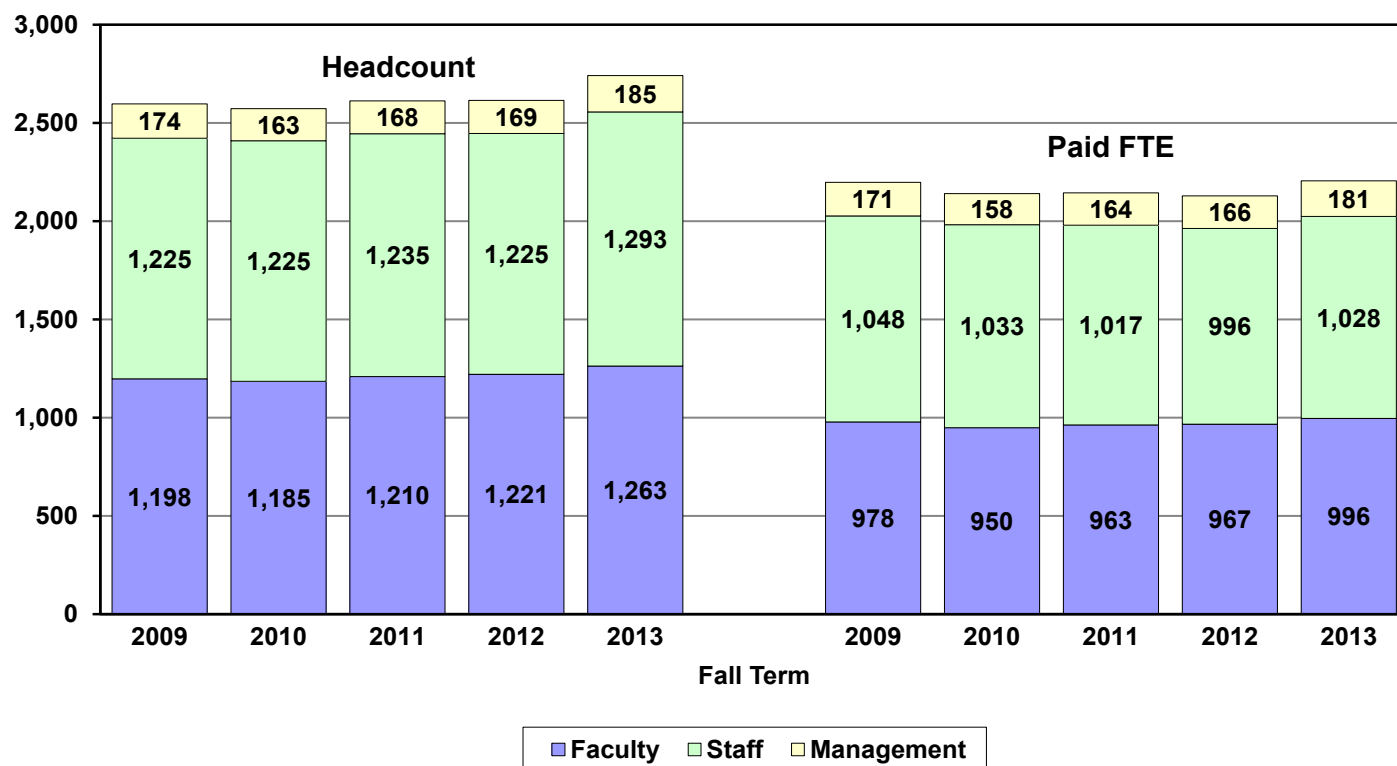
The average age of Cal Poly employees is 46.5 years, and the median years of service is 7.0 years.

Of tenured and tenure-track faculty, 93.1% have a doctorate or the terminal degree in their field.

### Notes:

- Employees can have multiple appointments. For headcounts, employees are only counted once in each employee type and once in the total employees profile according to their primary appointment.
- Whereas headcounts are according to primary appointments, FTE (full-time equivalent) is a summation of each individual appointment.
- "Paid" FTE is the amount of FTE the employee is paid for. In the faculty profile, "instructional" FTE is the portion of "paid" FTE devoted to instructional activities, including release time.
- Faculty FTE figures may differ slightly from previous Fact Books, because some inconsistencies were found and corrected.

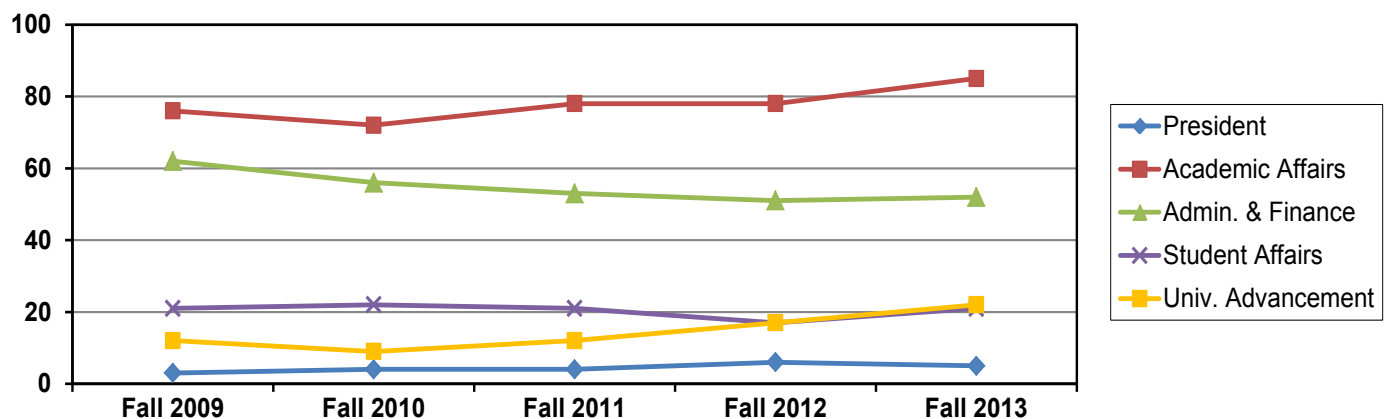

## Financial Aid Awards Profile — Aid Year 2012-13

Cal Poly disbursed a total of \$136,125,425 of financial aid in aid year 2012-13. As shown in the charts below, 67.1% of this aid was from federal sources (Source of Aid) and 58.4% was in the form of loans (Type of Aid).

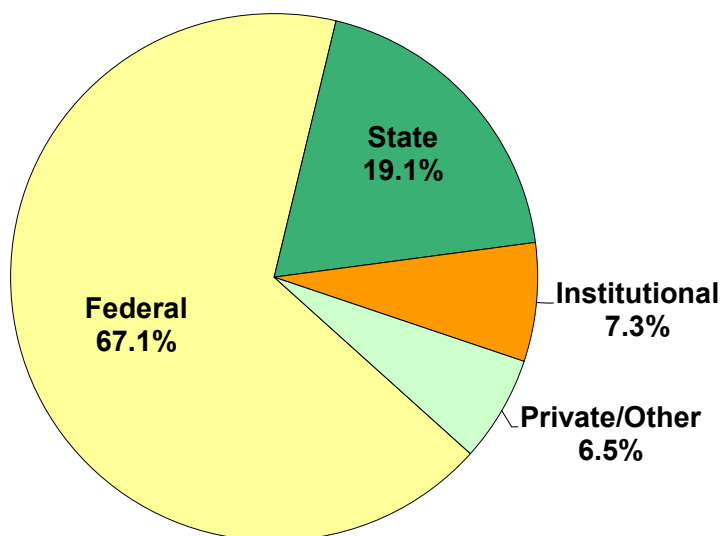
The overall average award was \$4,183. The average loan was \$5,548, while the average scholarship was \$1,833.

A total of 10,750 students received aid in aid year 2012-13. The overall average total aid package per student was \$12,663. Total aid disbursed decreased 0.2% (\$307,397) from the previous year and 12.4% (\$15 million) from two years ago.

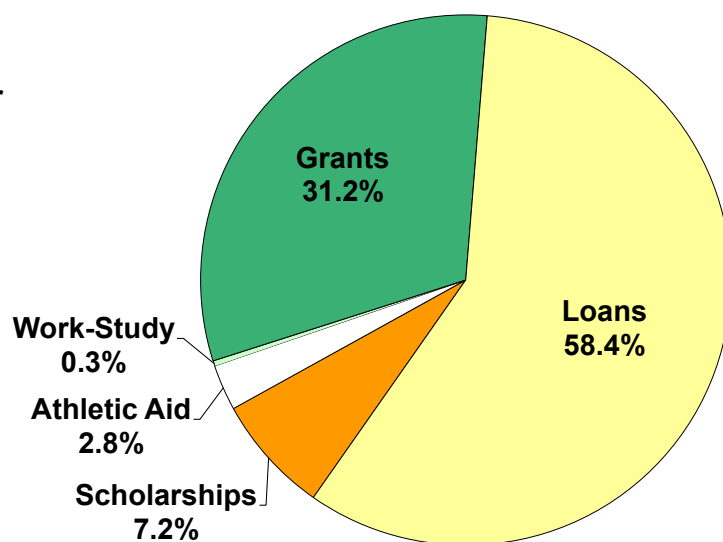
