CONFERENCE: "Action for Life"
July 2-5, 1981, Cedar Crest College,
Allentown, Pennsylvania

A major training, mobilization, and planning conference for vegetarian and animal rights action will be held this summer. This conference represents a cooperative effort by 20 participating organizations, including the American Natural Hygiene Society, Animal Protection Institute, Animal Rights
Network, Beauty Without Cruelty, the

Fund for Animals, Institute for Study of Animal Problems, Society for Animal Rights, Vegetarian Information Service, and Vegetarian Times.

The program is being designed to train and mobilize concerned individuals to promote vegetarian, animal rights, and related life-enhancing objectives. Intensive workshops led by experienced operatives from the peace, civil rights, feminist, and other progressive movements will provide training in assertiveness, presentations, time management, organizing, tactical planning, litigation, coalitions, boycotts, demonstrations, lobbying, media relations, and similar proven techniques for social change. Special task forces will be mobilized to carry on the effort on behalf of narrowly defined objectives.

Noted comedian and activist Dick Gregory, Nobel Laureate Issac Bashevis Singer, and Representative Andrew Jacobs (D-IN) have been invited to keynote this unprecedented undertaking. Movement leaders will present their respective priorities and approaches to current issues. Special exhibits and reference sessions with movement veterans will be arranged to assist newcomers. A vegan diet, child care, and ample recreational opportunities will be available.
