Rutan to be honored at Fall Convocation

The university will honor legendary aircraft designer and aeronautical engineering alumnus Burt Rutan during Fall Convocation, **Friday, Sept. 16**. President Warren J. Baker will present the President's Medal of Excellence to Rutan at a **9:30 a.m. ceremony in the Christopher Cohan Center, Harman Hall**. The medal has been awarded on just three previous occasions. Rutan, developer of SpaceShipOne, the world's first privately built aircraft to reach space and win the \$10-million Ansari X PRIZE, will deliver the keynote address, "Space, for the Rest of Us."

Rosemary Bowker, 1945 - 2005

Rosemary Bowker died peacefully at her home Friday, Aug. 26, 2005, just shy of her 60th birthday. She was supported by friends and family after a long struggle with cancer. Rosemary was born in Pompton Lakes, N.J., Oct. 21, 1945, to Marie and Frank Campagna. She earned her bachelor's degree at the College of St. Rose in Albany, N.Y., and worked toward her Ph.D. in marine biology at the University of Delaware where she met her future husband, Les Bowker. They married on July 10, 1976, and moved to San Luis Obispo. Rosemary earned her master's in biology at Cal Poly where she was employed as a computer consultant for the Biological Sciences Department until her retirement in 2004. She led the University Staff Council and received the Outstanding Staff Award for 1992-93.
