Animal Legislation is an organization that seeks, through its newsletter Animal Legislation, published periodically throughout the year, to inform voters about animal abuses, proposed Congressional legislation to stop the abuses, legislators who are supporting the legislation and what every citizen can do to help. Animal Legislation is one of the few organizations that attempts to educate voters by making such direct connections between abuses, legislation, and legislators.

Annual subscription/membership dues are \$10.00. The organization is in the process of applying for its not-for-profit, tax-exempt status. Checks for dues should be made payable to "Animal Legislation."

### Mobilization for Animals

The group organizing major demonstrations at the regional primate research centers in Boston, Madison, and Seattle scheduled for April 24, 1983, has incorporated as an independent non-profit entity, Mobilization for Animals, Inc. (MFA).

MFA supersedes and includes the mass mobilization task forces formed at the Action for Life conference in July, 1981, and the Mobilization for Animal Rights conference in October, 1981. The board of directors of the group includes all the coordinators of those task forces and all members, accounts, records, and responsibilities of the task forces have been assumed by MFA.

Mobilization for Animals is dedicated to initiating a direct action campaign to liberate animals from suffering and exploitation. The immediate emphasis is on the April, 1983, primate centers demonstrations as the first stage in this campaign. We intend through this action to build and develop a coordinated grassroots

network aimed at continuing direct action on all issues related to animal rights and liberation including vivisection, factory farming, hunting and trapping, the use of animals for entertainment, and other areas of animal abuse.

MFA is planning a national conference to build for the April, 1983, demonstrations and to plan direct action beyond that date. Details of that conference will appear in the next issue of Agenda magazine and elsewhere.

### **The Philosopher's Index**

An up-to-date quarterly index with abstracts of philosophy books and journals. An annual cumulative edition is also published. In addition, two retrospective indexes have been published, i.e., the *Retrospective Index to U.S. Publications From 1940* and the *Retrospective Index to non-U.S. English Language Publications From 1940*.

### **Dialog**

A computerized search service which provides custom bibliographies with abstracts on any logical combination of philosophical topics.

### **Philosophy Research Archives**

The microfiche journal of philosophy which publishes articles, translations, monographs, and bibliographies.

### **Teaching Philosophy**

Explores ideas about teaching and learning philosophy by publishing articles, discussions, and reports on new courses, methods, materials and their impact on philosophy. Textbook and audio-visual reviews are regular features.

### **American Philosophical Quarterly**

A scholarly journal which publishes articles by philosophers of any country on any aspect of philosophy. (Formerly published by Basil Blackwell, Oxford)

### **Bibliographies of Famous Philosophers**

Hardbound bibliographies have been published on Edmund Husserl, Jean-Paul Sartre, Alfred North-Whitehead, and Henri Bergson. Forthcoming bibliographies include works on Martin Heidegger and George Santayana.

### **Directory of American Philosophers**

Covers the United States and Canada with information on faculties of philosophy, names, addresses, and specialties of philosophers, data on colleges and universities, philosophical societies, centers, institutes, journals, publishers, and data on fellowships and assistantships. Statistics on the profession. 1982-83 edition published January 1982.

### **International Directory of Philosophy**

Covers Europe, Central and South America, Asia, Africa, and Australia. This directory provides names, addresses, and specialties of philosophers as well as data on colleges, universities, philosophical societies, institutes, journals, and publishers of philosophical works. 1982-85 edition published January 1982.

### **Directory of Women in Philosophy**

A handbook of women in philosophy, with information on fields of specialization, degree (date and institution), dissertation or publications, position, institution, dossier source, address, and telephone number. 1981-82 edition published February 1981.

### **Mailing Labels**

Labels of approximately 9,600 philosophers in the United States and Canada are available as well as addresses by specialty, i.e., Ethics, Aesthetics, etc.

### **Journal Typesetting**

Journals are economically typeset using computer driven photo-composition equipment. Books, ads, and other documents can also be done.
