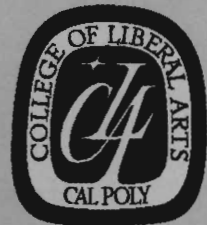

FACT: CSU faculty work longer hours both inside and outside the University than faculty across the nation.

FACT: Between 1993 & 2002, the number of CSU

managers grew by 41.4%. In the same period, tenure track hires increased by 8%.

FACT: For over a decade, CSU faculty salaries have lagged behind salaries at comparable institutions.

FACT: While hiring of temporary lecturers has mushroomed in the CSU system, tenure-track hiring has stagnated.

FACT: Student-faculty ratios in the CSU are rising -- at the same time, faculty-administrator ratios are also rising.

FACT: Half the CSU faculty are lecturers, who have little job security, larger teaching loads, and fewer benefits than tenure-track faculty.
