Professor, Students to Unveil Post-Disaster Clean Water Kit Saturday

Cal Poly faculty member Tryg Lundquist and his students will publicly unveil their patented invention – the Polytech Waterbag – at the National Collegiate Inventors and Innovators Alliance (NCIIA) March Madness for the Mind showcase in San Francisco. The Polytech Waterbag is a 10-liter plastic bag equipped with carrying straps and an integrated filter with a dispensing port. It uses Procter & Gamble's PUR chemical treatment packets remove particles and pathogens from untreated water. It is more compact than standard five-gallon water jugs that are typically shipped to disaster areas and can treat enough water to supply water to a family of four for up to 10 days.
