The Senate Instruction Committee has agreed to work with my office on teaching effectiveness projects associated with faculty development. This is clearly within the mission of the Committee, and the members are looking forward to taking an active role in this program.

I would like the Committee to serve as a consultative body in the review and recommendation of individuals and proposals for Academic Program Improvement Grants, the CSU Teacher/Scholar Institute, and other programs aimed at teaching effectiveness. This is a somewhat different role than that which the Committee has assumed in the past, and because of this, the Committee requests an acknowledgement by the Executive Committee or the Senate regarding this function.

Thanks again for your help in this, Jim. I'm excited about the possibilities of developing teaching effectiveness activities at a much higher level on the campus.

Teaching Effectiveness Activities

1. Survey the faculty to determine areas of need and interest to improve teaching.
2. Arrange for faculty workshops addressing such topics as:
 - a. how to prepare a syllabus.
 - b. how to select textbooks.
 - c. evaluation--strengths and weaknesses of different types of examinations. How to make exams.
 - d. teleconferencing.
 - e. dealing with difficult students.
 - f. advising techniques.
 - g. curriculum models in higher education.
 - h. computer-based instruction.
 - i. interactive digital video.
 - j. small group and collaborative instruction.
 - k. writing across the curriculum.
 - l. assessing student needs and progress.
 - m. handling learning-disabled students.
3. Academic Program Improvement Grants

Call for applications, review them, and make recommendations.
4. CSU Teacher/Scholar Institute:

Coordinate campus participation in the summer institute.
5. Fall conference teaching effectiveness workshop.

Coordinate this event if it is to continue.

The Committee will be supported by the Associate VP for Academic Affairs' office.

Background statement: The term of office for elected senators is two years; however, if a senator is required to vacate her/his position before the end of the completed term, then the individual appointed to fill the temporary vacancy can only "serve until the next regular election."

RESOLUTION ON
ACADEMIC SENATE MEMBERSHIP TERMS

- WHEREAS, Over a period of years, the need to fill two-year vacancies with one-year appointments has unbalanced the term-endings within each school/Professional Consultative Services caucus; therefore, be it
- RESOLVED: That permanent term-endings be assigned to each member's position; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That when a vacancy occurs in the Academic Senate, the individual appointed to fill such vacancy shall serve for the remainder of the term instead of only serving "until the next regular election", as stated in Academic Senate Bylaws Article II.B.; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That Article II.B. of the Academic Senate Bylaws be changed as follows:

TERM OF OFFICE

The elected term of office shall be two years. A senator shall serve a maximum of two consecutive, elected terms and shall not again be eligible for election until one year has elapsed. A senator appointed to fill a temporary vacancy shall serve until the ~~next/regular/election/for/members/of/the/senate/~~completion of that term, or until the senator being temporarily replaced returns, whichever occurs first. If this temporary appointment is for one year or less, it shall not be counted as part of the two-term maximum for elected senators.
