The new and expanded services are the result of a bidding process aimed at providing the best service at the best price to Cal Poly customers, Mustang Graphics Director Steve Godin said.

Design services range from simple layouts to marketing campaigns and magazine design. For digital printing, both black-and-white and four-color, pricing is competitive with off-campus providers, Godin said. Mustang Graphics made a major expansion in its offset printing capability, enabling high-quality long runs. PERS service-credit purchase begins Jan. 1

Active members of CalPERS will be able to purchase up to five years of service credit as of Jan. 1 under AB 719, recently signed by Gov. Davis.

To buy credit, members must have five years of "earned" CalPERS service. Any other purchased service credit, such as for military leave or public service, will not count toward the five-year earned-credit requirement.

Employees will be required to pay the full present value of the benefit, which would include both employee and employer contributions. Recent changes in federal tax laws would allow employees to roll funds over from personal tax-qualified savings accounts, such as 403(b), 401(k) and 457 to help buy the service credit.

CalPERS is developing procedures and forms and will update its Web site to provide the latest information as well as a service-credit calculator (see <https://www.calpers.ca.gov/mss-scce/Welcome.jsp>) to help employees determine the cost of buying the credit. Agriculture installs campus wireless network

Students, the faculty and staff members in the main College of Agriculture complex can now access the campus computer network and Internet through wireless devices.

The project provides access from Ag Circle, the first and second floors of the Erhart Ag Building, the patio area along the stairs of the Ag Sciences Building, and the bleacher area (the "ramp") of the BioResource and Agricultural Engineering Shop.
