Before coming to Cal Poly in 1982, Papakyriazis taught at UC Riverside. She earned a bachelor's degree in political science from the Athens School of Political Science and Economics in 1962, a master's degree in economics from UCSB in 1969 and a doctorate in economics from UC Riverside in 1982.

the learning process. The course framework will help colleagues:

- Maintain a focus on learning;
- Study the learning process; and
- Plan curriculum, instruction, and assessment.

"Maintaining Instructor Effectiveness" will be taught 8-11 a.m. The course emphasizes the practical applications of research to college teaching. Topics will include:

- Which elements make instruction effective;
- How to motivate students;
- How to be sure students are learning; and
- How to get students to remember material taught.

## Northridge prof to give colloquium Nov. 29

Ann Watkins, professor of mathematics at Cal State Northridge and incoming president of the Mathematical Association of America, will present "If Statistics Isn't Mathematics, We Can't Go On Meeting Like This" at a joint Mathematics-Statistics Colloquium 4:10-5 p.m. Nov. 30 in Room 205 in the Mott Physical Education Building.

She will discuss the extent to which academic mathematicians and statisticians have common interests and will explore how to improve communication to pursue shared goals.

Watkins will also talk about the recent collaboration between the Mathematical Association of America and the American Statistical Association and will address the common interests of both societies, including the content of the respective undergraduate majors, the dearth of majors in mathematics and statistics, equitable treatment for statisticians in mathematics departments, the secondary school curriculum and the Advanced Placement Program, and training the mathematicians who teach statistics.

Watkins was recently elected a Fellow of the American Statistical Association.

## Recreation Center improvements under way

A new rubberized floor will be installed in the ASI Recreation Center's upstairs exercise room, which will require closing the exercise rooms in two phases.

The smaller room has been closed since Nov. 17. The larger room will close at 7 p.m. Dec. 8.

During this time, limited cardiovascular equipment — not including weights — will be available downstairs near the racquetball courts.

The new floor will provide better shock absorption and a uniform look throughout the cardio-fitness and weight rooms.

Ceiling fans and additional mirrors are also being installed, and the interior walls will be repainted.

Both exercise rooms are scheduled to reopen Jan. 15.
