Performance artist Joan Schirle to appear Saturday

Internationally renowned physical theater performer Joan Schirle, co-artistic director of the Dell'Arte Company, will bring her critically acclaimed one-woman show, "Second Skin," to the Theatre at 8 p.m. Saturday (Dec. 7). With the help of masks, she transports the audience to the threshold of the after-life.

In a series of virtuosic transformations, Schirle introduces the audience to a group of 15 unforgettable characters, all related to a young woman convinced she possesses the living soul of Marilyn Monroe.

"Second Skin" has been described by critics as "inspiring," "mesmerizing," "funny," "beautiful," "stunning," "moving," "magical" and "a tour de force."

The Dell'Arte Company is one of a few actor-managed ensembles in the United States. It has an international

reputation for its touring performances and professional school, the Dell'Arte International School of Physical Theatre.

Tickets to the performance are \$6. "Second Skin" is presented by the Theatre and Dance Department with funds from the Cal Poly Plan. □
