### Cal Poly Arts announces new season

An all-woman a cappella choir and an all-male vocal ensemble. A guitar summit and a Canadian brass group. Mariachis and music from Moscow, Madagascar and Zimbabwe. All will be part of Cal Poly Arts' 1995-96 season.

With the theme "With One Voice," the season opens Sept. 15 with the Mariachi Los Camperos de Nati Cano, a colorfully costumed group that presents traditional Mexican music and dances.

Some of the multicultural musical performances scheduled during Cal Poly Arts' 11th annual season include El Vez and the Memphis Mariachis, the Chamber Orchestra Kremlin, and Echoes of Africa.

Highlighting the Great Performances series will be appearances by the all-male voice orchestra Chanticleer, Nikolais and Murray Louis Dance, the Toronto Dance Theatre, and the annual Baroque Concert.

The University Art Gallery in the Dexter Building will celebrate its 10th season with exhibits featuring women artists and multicultural themes.

Artists of national and international acclaim are scheduled to show their work during the 1995-96 season, beginning Sept. 24 with Selected Photographs by Imogen Cunningham.

The first exhibit will run through Oct. 28 and will include a screening of documentary films about photographers Imogen Cunningham and Dorothea Lange.

Other exhibits will feature photographs by community college faculty members, paintings and etchings by Betty LaDuke, an installation piece, the annual Art and Design Department Juried Student Exhibition, and a show presenting the work of professional graphic designers.

A new on-line directory of faculty and staff information is now available to computer users both on and off campus, and you should check it out soon to check your e-mail address.

The directory contains information about employees at Cal Poly, including name, department, office location, telephone and fax numbers, and e-mail address, if available. An announcement flyer and a Directory Server User Guide were sent to all faculty and staff members last week.

The user guide shows how to look at the directory. Information Technology Services encourages all faculty and staff members to look at the directory as soon as possible and check your entry.

It is especially important to verify your e-mail address. This e-mail address will be used in the future to forward e-mail to your account.
