CLASSIFICATION

The following progress report was presented from the Professional Ethics Committee:

PROFESSIONAL ETHICS

Representatives from AAUP, CCUFA, CSACP and CSEA were invited to join with the Professional Ethics Committee in developing a faculty code of ethics. Weekly meetings are being held for this purpose.

The code is being developed as per the guide lines adopted by the Faculty-Staff Council on May 21, 1963. It is anticipated that the committee will have a suggested code for presentation to the Council for the April meeting.

#### GRADING GUIDELINES

Mansfield Clinnick is acting as chairman for the sub-committee to develop grading guidelines. The committee is meeting every other week. The members are consulting with as many faculty members as possible for a campus-wide expression of opinions on grading problems and systems.

We hope to formulate some grading guidelines for presentation to the Council at the May meeting.

Marcus Gold, Chairman, Ad Hoc Committee on Possible Work Week Changes, asked for discussion on this subject and said that work is continuing.
