Tickets - \$50, \$45 for students, and \$15 for designated drivers - will go on sale March 1. There will be about 1,000 available.

The proceeds will go toward Cal Poly's Wine and Viticulture Program and to the Vines to Wines club.

Vines to Wines also will host a barbeque Friday, April 24 at the Cal Poly Arboretum. This event will be for alumni members to mingle with winemakers from the attending wineries. There also will be a live auction. The event will cost \$50, and space is limited to 220 guests.
