Compton firm low bidder for co-generation system

Scott Co. of California, a Compton-based mechanical construction firm, is the apparent low bidder for installation of an electrical co-generation system at Cal Poly.

The Scott Co. bid was \$666,000. The system will use steam from exhaust and cooling systems to generate 70 percent of the electricity needed for Sierra Madre and Yosemite residence halls and Vista Grande dining facility.

The system's energy savings are expected to repay its cost in about eight years. Funds for installation are being provided by a low-interest federal loan and reserves in the university's Dormitory Revenue Fund.

New campus map available

Departments and offices still having supplies of the May 1982 (and earlier) revision of the campus map should destroy them and order a fresh supply of the newly revised August 1983 version of the maps.

The latest revision reflects changes in the names of several campus streets, changes in locations of several major university offices and departments, and location of the construction site for the new engineering building.

Swansen exhibit in library

"A Search for the Essence of Certain Periods of Architectural History" is the title of the third annual exhibition of watercolors and ink drawings by Cal Poly artist and architectural historian Vern Swansen.

The exhibit is now on display and continues through Oct. 14 in the Gallery of the Robert E. Kennedy Library. It includes more than 160 pieces in a variety of styles, all done in the past year and displayed for the first time. Many were completed during a European tour.

The display is open to the public during regular library hours.

West named to federal board by Pres. Reagan

President Ronald Reagan has named Howard West to the International Private Enterprise Task Force. The 19-member body was established by executive order of the President earlier this year.

West, the university's associate executive vice president, said the Task Force advises the President and the federal government on ways in which private enterprise can become more involved in the development of the Third World countries.

A member of the Cal Poly staff since 1959, West once served as the university's director of international education.



Alumni relations director resigns

Steve Riddell, director of alumni relations and executive director of the Cal Poly Alumni Association, has resigned from the university. He has been named director of development at the Agricultural Education Foundation.

As director of alumni relations at Cal Poly, Riddell orchestrated the development of the Alumni Association from a 2,000-member organization to a thriving nationwide operation which today numbers over 16,000 paid members.

A member of the Cal Poly staff for the past nine years, Riddell will remain in San Luis Obispo in his new position.
