BOMB TRIO

Terrorists rock coast

UPI - A trio of bombs up and down the West Coast early Thursday rocked a courtroom, a National Guard armory, and the basement of a university building which houses Navy and ROTC offices. There were no injuries.

The first blast wrecked the San Rafael, Calif., courtroom of Superior Court Judge Joseph G. Wilson who has been holding some hearings within San Quentin State Prison.

Inspector Bowen Bridges of the Marin County Sheriff's Department called it "quite a blast."

It occurred at 1:27 a.m. in the Marin County Civic Center, the same location where another Marin County jurist and three other persons were killed two months ago in an unsuccessful attempt by three convicts and accomplice to escape from a courtroom.

At 4:44 a.m., a single bomb exploded in the basement of Clark Hall at the University of Washington in Seattle. The blast sent a shower of glass 40-50 feet from the building.

A janitor who was in the building managed to get out before the explosion, after security officers were told 22 minutes before that a bomb was set to go off.

The third blast hit a National Guard armory at Santa Barbara, Calif., blowing out a door and several windows in the west wing of the building and ripping out chunks of concrete.

The 4:15 a.m. explosion rocked the entire downtown area.

Authorities were tipped five minutes in advance of the San Rafael explosion. Inspector Bridges said an anonymous woman caller told a San Francisco telephone operator of the bomb. The operator immediately notified the Marin County Sheriff's Department.

Judge Wilson had been holding some preliminary hearings in San Quentin in an effort to forego any possibility of an escape attempt similar to the one that killed Superior Court Judge Harold Haley in August.

In Santa Barbara, police said outside authorities were being called in to investigate the blast. The explosion followed closely on the heels of an announcement by the militant Weatherman organization that Santa Barbara would be one of its targets for violence this year.

The bombing occurred on the north side of the armory, the only side not protected by high chain

link fence. National Guard officials said anyone walking by on the street could have access.

A door was blown off its hinges and numerous windows were blown.

No one was inside the building at the time. A large hole was blown in a wall.

In Seattle, security officers notified of the bomb were able to rope off the area and alert the janitor.

There was no structural damage to the building although some interior plaster cracked. A small fire which broke out was quickly extinguished.

Ronald Reagan today angrily predicted that there will be more "cowardly and despicable guerilla" bombings like the ones that rocked Santa Barbara, San Rafael, and Seattle.

Reagan told newsmen that the "radical factions that are in back of this sort of thing have made it plain that they plan to abandon wide scale rioting and embark on guerilla-like terror tactics."

Reagan noted that the 1970 legislature passed a bill, supported by him, to extend the death penalty to persons who plant bombs which cause injury.

Little people convention

The little people are coming to San Luis Obispo this weekend. They are coming to attend the semi-annual convention of the Little People of America (LPA).

Evan Artran and his wife Marilyn are the co-chairman of the district convention which will host delegates from California, Nevada and Hawaii. Some 50 to 60 people are expected to attend the meeting which will be held Oct. 9, 10, and 11 at the Motel Inn on Monterey Street.

Artran, a Printing Management major at Cal Poly, is a dwarf by definition. This means he is less than 55 inches tall, has short legs, and a proportionately larger head. Being of normal mental development, he feels that most of societies prejudices have been overcome in relation to undersized adults. He states that most of the stares, pointing and taunts come from children rather than adults.

While society has gotten over many of its prejudices, problems still exist. Employment is the major one, and it specifically involves the means by which little people can compete in a world designed for larger inhabitants.

As with most people with something basically in common,

the convention of little people also includes midgets. Midgets differ from dwarfs in that while still being small in stature, their limbs and torso are all in proportion.

The LPA was formed 13 years ago in Los Angeles by Billy Barty, a nationally known TV personality. Starting with just 20 members in 1957, the organization has grown to over 1500 members, living in every state and several foreign countries.

None of the members are over 4'10" in height, the average being about 4'3". The purpose of the LPA is to provide a basis by which a member can meet others of his own height, and discuss their mutual problems. These problems can include clothes to extensions for driving automobiles.

Hereditary factors play a large role in dwarfism, which occurs only once in one-million births between average sized people. A dwarf couple, however, stands a 50-50 chance of a dwarf birth. To discuss these and other medically involved factors to dwarfism, is a scheduled speaker from the Mayo Clinic.

Blue-collar jobs are difficult for small people to handle, Artran said. Since machinery is planned

Live action and entertainment will be spotlighted weekly for folk music buffs when the Special Events Committee swings its new program into action. The Committee will sponsor folk singing





Mustangs next Reno

The ride is all over.

With their three easiest games behind them, the Mustangs will meet their toughest opponent so far of the season. This weekend the University of Nevada Wolf Pack, which boasts a 3-0 record, invades Mustang Stadium.

The Nevada Wolf Pack has scored victories over San Francisco State, 28-6, U.C. Riverside, 45-26, and Willamette, 30-3. The only team in common to the two schools is S.F. State, whom the Mustangs murdered, 63-4.

"Getting it all together" was the apparent theme to Coach Joe Harper's comments about Nevada. "We will be going against an undefeated football team. Nevada is the strongest and deepest team that we've met to date."

Harper pointed out that "they have five running backs over 200 pounds." One of these speedsters is 6-1, 225 pound Dennis Smock. The top ball carrier for the Wolf Pack is halfback Earnest O'Leary. He has earned 174 yards in 27 carries.

The Green Machine has averaged 327.3 yards a game rushing and 194.7 yards average passing. Meanwhile, the Wolf Pack shows an average of 180.3 yards rushing, and 203 yards passing. It is quite clear that something will have to give when

the two teams clash on Saturday. "It's a team very much like Boise State, last year." Boise State beat the Mustangs last year, 17-7. This year, however, the

Mustangs outranked Boise in the national rating, holding 13th place, while Boise sits 18th.

In the CCAA team statistics, Cal Poly is leading in six offensive categories, and one defensive column. The Mustangs are

heading up the rushing, passing, total offense, scoring, punt

returns and interception columns. Defensively, the Mustangs lead in passing with 29 completed out of 74 attempts.

Individually, tailback Darryl

Thornes holds top honors in scoring and rushing, with five TDs and 231 yards gained. Don Milan leads in total offense with 180 yards rushing, 447 passing yards for a total of 616 yards. Quarterback Milan also heads up the passing with 32 attempts and 18 completions.

This week's game should begin to tell the story of the Mustangs true capacity. It's time to get it together.


