Suicide Intervention Training Set for June

Cal Poly will offer Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST) for individuals who want to feel more comfortable, confident and competent in helping to prevent the immediate risk of suicide. More than 950,000 caregivers have received this training. Just as "CPR" skills make physical first aid possible, training in suicide intervention develops the skills needed for suicide first aid. ASIST is a two-day, intensive, interactive and practice-dominated course designed to help caregivers recognize risk and learn how to intervene to prevent the immediate risk of suicide. While ASIST trainings typically cost participants \$250 to \$300, members of the Cal Poly community are temporarily able to participate in ASIST on campus at no cost. This training is funded through the Cal MHA and Prop 63 funds distributed through the CSU Chancellor's Office to campus via Martin Bragg, director of health and counseling services. The next ASIST is scheduled for Thursday and Friday, June 27 and 28. The training is 15 hours in total, and must be completed over the course of two consecutive days.
