Campus Conversations to Begin Oct. 10

Many faculty and staff have asked for more transparency and context regarding a broad array of university operations, including more detailed information about the Cal Poly budget, University Advancement's strategies, and other important campus topics. The first of these briefings, called Campus Conversations, will be held twice, from 10 to 11:30 a.m. Oct. 10 and 11 in the Left Wing of Chumash Auditorium (UU, Room 204). Cal Poly's Journalism Department is the first in the California State University system to launch an integrated, digital-first, student-run news organization as part of its journalism curriculum. Mustang Media Group (MMG) is breaking down walls that previously separated students in print, broadcast and digital news to create a full-circle media organization. After 43 years of dedication to the field of health education, prevention and disease control, Rojean Dominguez is retiring from Cal Poly. After she joined Health Services as health educator in 1994, she expanded the Peer Health Education program P.U.L.S.E. from one team to four, providing students the opportunity to experience career-building opportunities. She instituted the online risk reduction Alcohol-Wise course for incoming students, established the SAFER program for 24/7 sexual assault support, was advisor for the first U.S. university alcohol alternative club "Friday Night Live," introduced stress reduction programming with quarterly therapy dog programs and the RELAX Center at Health Center, and participated in the Health Professions Resource Group to help Cal Poly students prepare for professional health career entrance interviews. Dominguez was one of three staff to receive the first Cal Poly Chandler Award for exceptional service to students and the Division of Student Affairs in 1998. She also received the 2006 award for Student Affairs Innovation in Programs and Services. 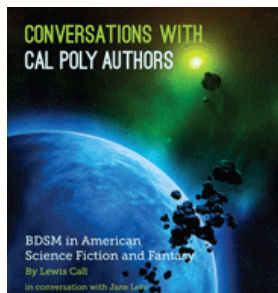
