**Presentation on 'Maori Warfare in Hawke's Bay, New Zealand' Set for Nov. 18**

Cal Poly will host Cal Poly Pomona Anthropology Professor Mark W. Allen for his presentation, "Maori Warfare in Hawke's Bay, New Zealand: An Archeologist's Journey to Middle Earth (and Back Again)" from 6:30 to 8 p.m. Monday, Nov. 18, in Spanos Theatre. Allen will discuss the results of his archaeological research focusing on the landscape of the prehistoric and early historic Maori sites in Hawke's Bay. The project has developed over the past 25 years, benefiting from a partnership between Allen and the Maori people of the region. Allen will track New Zealand history during the presentation, exploring how warfare, though a prevalent practice in Polynesia, eventually became an important part of Maori culture about 500 years ago.
