— Cal Poly-processed whole and half hams are available for \$3.55 per pound.

Cal Poly to Present Bandfest on Nov. 23

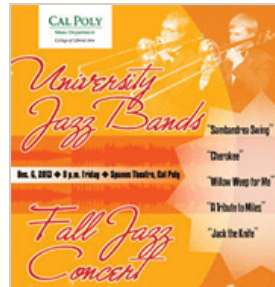
