Cal Poly Takes Big West Tournament Final, Advances to NCAA Tournament

The men's basketball team will advance to the NCAA Division I tournament for the first time in Cal Poly's history after defeating Cal State Northridge on Saturday night in the Big West Tournament Finals. Trailing 59-55 with little more than a minute left in the game, the Mustangs turned it around with three successive scores from different players, ending the game 61-59. The Mustangs will face Texas Southern on Wednesday, March 19, in the First Four, the first round of NCAA tournament play at the University of Dayton in Ohio. The game is scheduled for 3:40 p.m. PST and will air on truTV. A viewing party will be held in Chumash Auditorium. Starting at 3 p.m., the party will include music and discounted food. The game will be broadcast on the big screen, and televisions throughout the UU will broadcast the game. OCOB Students Take First Place in the West in IT/Accounting Competition

A team of Cal Poly students from the Orfalea College of Business took first place at the recent EY (Ernst and Young) Beam Abroad Case Competition held in Los Angeles, for students with an interest in information technology and/or accounting. Students must demonstrate an understanding of domestic and international accounting issues and global markets. The teams are given a week to prepare their presentations, which they give to a panel of EY judges. The students move to the final round to compete for the West region grand prize on April 4 in San Francisco. Members of the teams that compete in final round will be given preferential consideration for premier opportunities with EY, including its Global Student Exchange Program, Emerging Leaders Summit and Program, and the National Accounting Researcher Residency program.

Engineering Student Selected for Clinton Global Initiative University

Civil Engineering senior Chao Yang was selected to participate in the 2014 Clinton Global Initiative University (CGI U) to be held March 21-23 at Arizona State University. Building on the model of the [Clinton Global Initiative](#), which brings world leaders together to take action on global challenges, CGI U was launched in 2007 to engage the next generation of leaders on college campuses around the world. More than 1,200 student leaders will converge to discuss topics including education, environment and climate change, peace and human rights, poverty alleviation, and public health, and develop their own initiatives that address these concerns. STRIDE Hosts Visiting scholars from Tennessee and South Korea

The Kinesiology Department's STRIDE (Solutions Through Research in Diet & Exercise) program is hosting scholars from Tennessee and South Korea. The first is a team from Vanderbilt University and the YMCA of Middle Tennessee that will study STRIDE's Pink and Dude Chefs program to learn how to implement the program for diverse populations. spring. Professional Training on Composting to be Held March 24-28

The Center for Sustainability in the College of Agriculture, Food & Environmental Sciences will hold a five-day professional training program on composting March 24-28 at the Cal Poly Compost Unit. The training will be comprised of two segments: a four-day certificate training program on large-scale composting followed by a one-day workshop. The four-day workshop is designed to teach participants about the entire composting process, including site selection, management techniques, compost utilization, marketing strategies and the regulatory environment. Participants will also tour regional composting operations, farms and municipalities that have incorporated composting. A certificate of technical ability will be conferred upon completion of the course. The one-day workshop on March 28 will provide information for the effective assessment and use of compost for growers at all scales of production, building on information given at the four-day training. The four-day course is \$450, which includes instructional materials, lunch and breaks. The one-day workshop is \$150, though faculty, staff and students will be admitted free of charge.
