President Armstrong to Hold Listening Sessions, Give 'Vision 2022' Address

President Armstrong will hold listening sessions for faculty, staff and students during April and May and will also present a keynote address, "Vision 2022: The Future of Cal Poly," and a question-and-answer session from 2 to 4 p.m. Friday, May 2, in Harman Hall.

For the third year, the president has set aside time for listening sessions. As in previous years, the purpose of the sessions is to learn from faculty, staff and students about the direction in which Cal Poly is going. Based on feedback he has heard over the past three years, President Armstrong has developed a vision of what Cal Poly can look like in 2022.

The president hopes to discuss that vision at the listening sessions to get further input from faculty, staff and students. Some listening sessions are scheduled to occur prior to his keynote address; others are scheduled for after. The listening sessions will assist in the ongoing refinement of the vision for Cal Poly in 2022. Faculty and staff are encouraged to attend the "Vision 2022: The Future of Cal Poly" keynote address and a listening session to discuss this vision with President Armstrong.

Orfalea College of Business is No. 70 in Bloomberg's Top B-Schools Ranking

The Orfalea College of Business has been named to Bloomberg Businessweek's ninth annual ranking of the Best U.S. Undergraduate Business Schools. This year, the college was ranked No. 70. This marks the sixth consecutive year the college has been included in the list of 132 U.S. undergraduate business programs. Cal Poly was one of only four public universities in California to make the list. In all, eight California public and private universities were included.

"We are thrilled to again be included in Bloomberg Businessweek's highly selective list of the best undergraduate business programs in the United States," said Doug Cerf, interim dean of the Orfalea College of Business. "It is further proof that Cal Poly's unique Learn by Doing philosophy is a strategy for excellence." Bloomberg Businessweek draws its data from surveys sent to students, employers and recruiters, taking into account median starting salaries for graduates; the number of graduates admitted to the 35 highest-ranked

Professor of Film & Media at NY's Fashion Institute of Technology to Speak April 15

Michelle Handelman, a 2011 Guggenheim fellow and associate professor of film and media at the Fashion Institute of Technology in New York, will present a talk based on her work from 6 to 7 p.m. Tuesday, April 15, in the Baker Center (Building 180), Room 114. Handelman's presentation, titled "Gloom With a View," will focus on the stories and histories behind her latest three video installation projects: "This Delicate Monster," based on Charles Baudelaire's 1857 volume of French poetry "The Flowers of Evil"; "Dorian, A Cinematic Perfume," based on Oscar Wilde's 1889 novel "The Picture of Dorian Gray"; and "Irma Vep, The Last Breath," based on the character Irma Vep from the 1915 silent film "Les Vampires." This trilogy transforms gothic literary and film works into contemporary pieces that interweave personal history and the history of her performers through a queer feminist lens. Handelman uses video, live performance and photography to create confrontational works that explore the sublime in its various forms of excess and nothingness. The presentation is free

and open to the public. It is co-sponsored by the Art & Design and Women's & Gender Studies departments and the College of Liberal Arts Lottery Fund.

Cal Poly Festival Showcase: The Cal Poly Bands on April 25

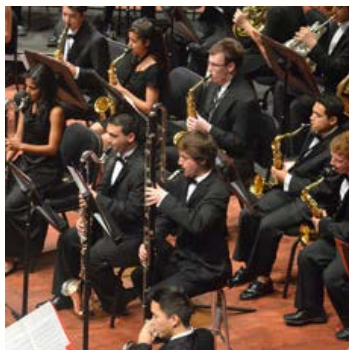
