CSU Trustees Approve Student Housing South Project at Grand Avenue Entrance

The California State University Board of Trustees approved construction of first-year student residence facilities near the Grand Avenue entrance to campus. The new facilities will be built on what is now a large surface parking lot across Grand Avenue from existing student housing and be home for about 1,400 first-year students. The board agreed that the project is essential to meet existing demand for student housing on campus and is a positive step toward



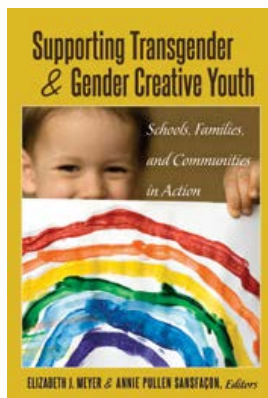

Kinesiology Student Wins \$67,000 NIH Award

Cal Poly kinesiology major Adrian Mercado received a \$67,000 Diversity Supplement Award from the National Institutes of Health (NIH). Mercado, a sophomore, is the first recipient of this award from Cal Poly. While still a freshman, Mercado volunteered as a team member on Kinesiology Professor Suzanne Phelan's NIH-funded Healthy Beginnings study, which investigates how

lifestyle intervention can promote healthy weight gain in overweight and obese women during pregnancy. The grant, which supports diversity in the biomedical field, will now fund Mercado's work on the project and enable the research team to collect placentas and umbilical cord blood from women participating in the study. Cal Poly anthropology and geography student Troy Lawson placed first in the Professional Digitally Displayed Cartographic Award competition at the California Geographical Society's 68th annual conference. Cal Poly Students Succeed at CSU Research Competition

Four Cal Poly projects placed first and one earned a second-place award at the 28th annual statewide CSU Student Research Competition. More than 200 students from campuses throughout the CSU gathered at Cal State East Bay to present the results of their original research. The competition is geared to both graduate and undergraduate students and has 10 categories: Behavioral and Social Sciences; Biological and Agricultural Sciences; Business, Economics, and Public Administration; Creative Arts and Design; Education; Engineering and Computer Science; Health, Nutrition, and Clinical Sciences; Humanities and Letters; Physical and Mathematical Sciences; and Interdisciplinary. A team of 10 students represented Cal Poly with projects that included a system to assist online game developers creating soundtracks, a device to improve blood flow in damaged cardiac blood vessels, and an analysis of how corporate farms impact the food availability of their region. humankind with other citizens of the planet," said Antonio Barata, RSVP artistic director.

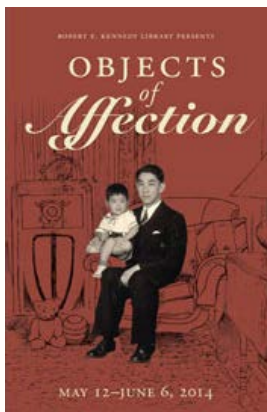
Wind Bands Concert to Feature Percussionist John Astaire on June 6
