Cal Poly Shares in \$53.7 Million Grant to Train STEM Teachers

The U.S. Department of Education awarded \$53.7 million to seven CSU campuses, including Cal Poly, to recruit, train and support more than 11,000 new teachers over the next five years. The awards are the culmination of this year's Teacher Quality Partnership (TQP) grant competition that President Obama announced in May at the White House Science Fair. For the first time, this year's TQP competition focused on preparing STEM (science, technology, engineering and math) teachers and increasing the participation of underrepresented populations — women, minorities and people with disabilities — in teaching STEM subjects. Voluntary Recall of Several Cal Poly Chocolates Varieties Announced

The Food Science & Nutrition Department in conjunction with the Cal Poly Corporation are voluntarily recalling multiple varieties of Cal Poly Chocolates candy bars because they have the potential to be contaminated with the following undeclared allergens: peanut, milk or soy. Products may also have been exposed to microbial contamination. The products are sold at retail outlets and farmers markets around the Central Coast, at on-campus locations, and online through the Cal Poly Bookstore. No illnesses have been reported. The voluntary recall is being initiated out of an abundance of caution. While there is no confirmation of the existence of a contaminant in the recalled products, an equipment operations failure was detected Friday, Oct. 3. The issue was immediately resolved. Capacity Building Workshop to be Held Mondays

Faculty, staff and students are invited to participate in the continuing Capacity Building Workshop series. The workshops for fall quarter will focus on change in complex human systems and will be held from noon to 2 p.m. Mondays in Kennedy Library, Room 511. All are welcome, even if attendance is intermittent. For those who might be new to the series, the workshop is intended to create a safe space to learn about change within ourselves and with respect to the university as an organization. Attendees can learn how to identify their own change models and how they might think differently about internal and external paradigms. Participants will be asked to relate experiences in terms of added "capacity" for the university as a whole, which can be expressed differently from person to person. As part of the exploration, the group will consider the Cynefin Framework of complexity. Cynefin means "place of multiple belongings" and relates complex, complicated, simple and chaotic systems. The group will explore how this sense-making model differs from standard categorization models and make comparisons to existing change models that could be applied in organizational transformation.
