University Holds Open Forum to Discuss March 7 Party and Roof Collapse

President Jeffrey D. Armstrong, Vice President Keith Humphrey and ASI President Joi Sullivan spoke at a public forum moderated by Dean of Students Jean DeCosta March 12. The event drew more than 500 students, faculty and staff, and members of the San Luis Obispo community to discuss student-community relations and the March 7 party that resulted in a



collapsed garage roof on Hathway Avenue. The forum was a chance for Armstrong, Humphrey and Sullivan to share their thoughts on the gathering and how such events can negatively impact individual students' futures as well as the university's relations with the nearby community. Dozens of attendees also spoke, giving their ideas on how the university, its students and the surrounding community can more effectively and positively coexist. History Professor Awarded \$152,000 NSF Grant for Slavery and Science Research

Cal Poly History Professor Kathleen Murphy received a National Science Foundation (NSF) grant for more than \$152,000 for her project "Exploring the Use of British Slave Trade Ships to Gather Biological Specimens and Data." Murphy's project examines the many connections between science and the slave trade and how slavery facilitated the production of scientific knowledge. Since many 18th century botanical specimens were found in West Africa, the Spanish Americas and the British Caribbean, naturalists exploited the slave trade to collect specimens. influences of the counterculture take hold. The book explores personal and social struggles amid larger issues of racial animosity and urban violence.

Grant Writing Workshop to be Offered Spring Quarter

The College of Agriculture, Food & Environmental Sciences, the Grants Development Office, and Sponsored Programs will offer a workshop on grant writing from 11 a.m. to noon Thursdays this spring. The nine-week program begins April 2 and will be held in the Erhart Agriculture Building (No. 10), Room 215. The workshop is for faculty or staff interested in research or research administration. The seminar will be a hands-on overview covering grant writing and research administration. Topics will include sources of funding, types of awards (grants, contracts and gifts), marketing ideas, how to approach sponsors, reading RFPs (request for proposals), what to include and not to include, abstracts, budgets and justifications, indirect costs, payroll and purchasing, and intellectual property and review processes. Writing and analysis will be done every week, and participants may bring their own examples for assistance and critique. By the end of the quarter, participants will be able to complete the majority of a proposal and will have knowledge of related contacts and resources at Cal Poly. The workshop will be team-taught by Sue Tonik, CAFES grants analyst, and staff from Grants Development and Sponsored Programs. Mustang News Breaks Record with State Media Convention Awards

Mustang News received 22 awards during the 31st annual Associated Collegiate Press (ACP) National College Journalism Convention held Feb. 26-March 1 in Los Angeles. Mustang News earned [19 state awards](#) from the California College Media Association (CCMA), seven of which were first place. This is the largest number of awards Cal Poly has earned from CCMA in a single judging cycle. The editorial team received first-place awards for Best Feature Story, Best Arts and Entertainment Story, and Best Infographic. Additionally, the Mustang News advertising team won first for Best Black-and-White Advertisement, Best Group Promotion, Best Sales Promotional Material, and Best Online Promotion. Mustang News also garnered three national Best of Show awards from the ACP.

Silicon Valley Entrepreneurs Program to Graduate First Class

The first cohort of 17 Cal Poly students immersed in an intensive 10-week entrepreneurship and innovation "boot camp," graduated from the new program March 12. The Silicon Valley Entrepreneurs: A Study-Away Entrepreneurship Immersion Program is a collaborative effort involving Cal Poly's Center for Innovation & Entrepreneurship (CIE) and Extended Education, and Draper University. Students from all disciplines throughout Cal Poly took part in a unique entrepreneurial experience in the world's capital of technology innovation: Silicon Valley. 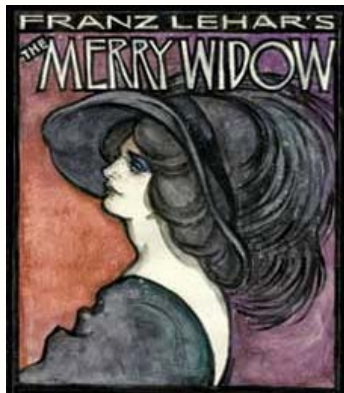
Celtic Musical Group to Perform March 27 at Spanos Theatre
