## Senate discusses free speech, elections

The ASI Student Senate passed a resolution in support of higher education Wednesday, but the free speech resolutions in the upcoming elections caused the most heated debate during the three hour meeting.

ASI Senator Tim Jones presented resolutions that would revise the Campus Administrative Manual, the Poly Royal advertising and petition policy, and create an appeals board for disputes concerning free speech on campus.

Jones was part of a five-person task force that examined present Cal Poly policies concerning free speech over the past year.

The revisions to the Poly Royal Advertising and Petition Policy generated the most discussion. Opposing the revisions was Chris Seymour, Poly Royal superintendent.

"We need to preserve the student ideas and Poly Royal purpose," he said. "With Poly Royal we are looking for a synthesis of ideas to see what people can do. This (policy) doesn't designate what is academically beneficial versus commercial."

Political Science Professor Richard Krantzorf, a member of the task force, said the revision was an attempt to expand free speech on campus.

"The task force created a much more expansive philosophy to allow petitions, circulars and the like during Poly Royal," he said. "The campus is functioning during Poly Royal and free speech shouldn't be restricted any time or place," he added.

Poly Royal representative to the Student Senate Tami Leopold commented

on the proposal to allow petitions to be distributed in booths.

"Petitions seem to get legs and stroll through the crowd," she said.

"We took over a year and a half on this," Jones said after the discussion. "We had open forums and brought in all sorts of people. The thing that is so ironic is that last year's Poly Royal superintendent asked us to review it, (the policy)"

The Senate also passed a resolution in Support of Higher Education. The resolution, copies of which are to be sent to Governor George Deukmejian, Senator Ken Maddy, and Assemblyman Eric Seastrand calls for the halting of the erosion of higher education.

Senator Tom Kimbrell from the school of Architecture and Environmental Design introduced a resolution for discussion concerning the add/drop policy at Cal Poly. The resolution, which will be voted on April 13, urges President Warren Baker, Vice President of Academic Affairs Tomlinson Fort, Jr., and the Academic Senate to adopt a campus-wide add policy.

ASI President Sandra Clary said during her officer's report that the Instructionally Related Activities board reconsidered its decision to initiate a fee increase without free admittance to IRA supported sports besides football. Clary reported that the board voted to keep the free admittance stipulation after the Senate urged them to reconsider. Students will be able to vote on the increase in a general election April 13 and 14.

Roy Gersten, ASI business director, said the Bank of America Versateller scheduled to arrive on campus this year will not be installed by Poly Royal, but should be in by the end of the quarter.

## Button sales to raise funds

"One, two, three, let go of the balloons," cried Mayor Melanie Billig at the kick-off of the Poly Royal Button sales Thursday in the University Union Plaza. The release of about 50 balloons by students in the audience officially started the button sale which will run through April 23.

The buttons, which cost \$1 each, will be sold by members of the Agriculture Department, the Collegiate Future Farmers of America, and El Corral Bookstore. Alpha Phi Alpha fraternity will also sell the buttons, said Neal Vaughn, co-chairman of the button sales.

Vaughn said the cooperation between the fraternity and the Agriculture Department on the sales is important because it "represents a seed planted in making conditions better" between blacks and whites at Cal Poly.

The Agriculture Department hopes to sell 7,000 buttons, said co-chairman Henri Barbe. Proceeds from the sale of the buttons go to the funding of activities such as the petting zoo that was recently held at Madonna Plaza, and to aid student teachers from the Agriculture Education Department who are out in the field.

The Agriculture Education Department is traditionally responsible for both the sale of the buttons

and the distribution of the Poly Royal posters, said Barbe.

Others present at the kick-off included Larry Rathbun, assistant dean administrator for the School of Agriculture and Natural Resources; Poly Royal princesses Susan Elliot, Nancy Gin, Vera Otto, and Laurie Jones; and Dale W. Andrews, executive vice president of

Academic Affairs.

Andrews is known as the "Father of the Poly Royal Button" because he first brought the concept of selling buttons as a fundraiser to Poly in 1965. This year's orange, blue, and white design, which carries the words "Poly Royal 1983" and "Excellence Through Experience," was designed by Ross Parsons, a senior graphic design major.

## Students sell six horses for \$76,000

Six Cal Poly thoroughbred race horses were sold for a total of \$76,000 on March 22 at the California Thoroughbred Breeders Association two-year old in training sales at Hollywood Park.

The horses were trained by Poly students through the Cal Poly Thoroughbred Project specifically for racing.

The project is designed to give students "hands on" experience with everything from foaling mares to training race horses.

"These horses are headed for the race track," said animal science instructor Roger Hunt.

Last October nine students began a profit-sharing enterprise with the Cal Poly Foundation,

which owns the horses. The students all signed contracts, making them agents. They incur all expenses from medical to feed. In addition, they are the trainers, exercise riders, and grooms.

Among the horses sold at this year's sales were Crowd Ruler, Overcharge, Panhandler, Raisa Banner, Twice an Orphan, and Speedy Talker.

## Food science majors learn with bananas, hams, jams

Where on campus can you find students making jam, apple juice, beef jerky, and frozen bananas?

In the home economics department?

Wrong.

These industrious students can be found in the food processing unit located behind the Campus Produce Store on North Perimeter Road.

The food processing unit is part of the Food Science Department in the School of Agriculture. It includes a large lab for making everything from canned tomatoes to sausage.

"Cal Poly has the largest food processing undergraduate program in the nation," said Bob Shimamura, president of the Food Processing Club.

The club is an integral part of the Food Science Department, having 100 members who make up one of the most active clubs on campus, said Shimamura.

"We like to be as active as we can," he said. "We have numerous social events such as picnics and sporting events."

Because of the nature of the department, the club also has an opportunity for some profitable projects.

Three of the club's major projects are the production of jams and jellies, the smoking and curing of hams, and the manufacturing of chocolate-covered frozen bananas.

Most of our projects are enterprises sponsored by the Cal Poly Foundation," said Shimamura. This means that all the materials needed for the projects are funded by the Foundation. This way, even if we don't make a profit on a product, all we lose is our time and effort," he said.

Food Processing Club hams are popular items and the club is always backed up with orders for them.

The making of these hams begins in the food processing unit's meat laboratory when they are smoked in a 570 F smokehouse for 16 hours.

"We burn damp natural hardwood chips to smoke the hams," said Shimamura. The chips are dampened before burning so they will burn for a longer period. "Hardwood is much more nutritionally safe than softwood because softwood contains tar and resin which may cause carcinogenic diseases," he added.

The frozen banana project is one of the club's more popular fund raisers. On hot days a booth is set-up outside the Campus Produce Store which sells the frozen treats for 50 cents a piece.

An old bicycle wheel with clothes pins has been turned into a rotating device used for dipping the bananas in chocolate and drying them. The bananas are bagged and frozen at -30 F.

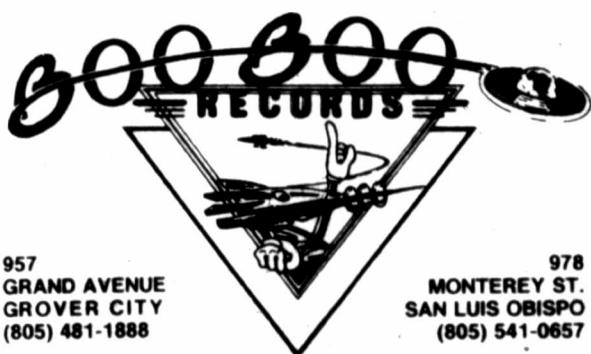

## Students learn to process food

"But we don't have to keep them frozen for long because they go so fast," said Shimamura. "We make about 6,000 bananas in a year and it takes a good deal of time and effort, adding there is much participation by club members."

The club's jam and jelly enterprise involves a complicated procedure. It begins with the cleaning of the fruit, which is then put into huge cylindrical shaped "vacuum pans" that heat and thicken the fruit and remove excess moisture. The thickened fruit then goes to a "jam kettle" for mixing and then on to the "simplex filler" for dispensation into jars.

"We cook the jam with steam," said Shimamura. "Steam is the best way to heat it."

The jam must then be immediately cooled in the "rain cooler" before it has time to spoil.

The jam enterprise makes three types of products: strawberry jam, olallie berry jam and a three-fruits marmalade of lemons, oranges and grapefruits.

"We try to give Poly the first opportunity to supply the fruit, but for the most part they do not produce enough so we have to go to off-campus sources," said Shimamura.

The food processing lab used to produce these goods is extensive. Some of its equipment includes an "apple peeler" which peels and cores apples at the same time, a "flaker" which can shave grains to make cereal, a "can seamer" used to seal metal cans, a pizza oven, a

machine which measures the tenderness of meat, and a variety of sorters and washers.

The lab's "freeze dryer" is used to make dehydrated food for backpackers. A piece of frozen lasagna can be dried and in 24 hours look like a cracker!

The students also are encouraged to experiment with their own individual enterprises. For instance, Shimamura is currently working on his senior project "Tofu Jerky."

Everything made in the lab is put to good use. It is either sold in the campus store or is ordered by the general public.

In the Meats Lab students learn to make different cuts of meat from beef, pork and lamb. They also learn to make sausage using natural casings of animal intestines.

"Our meats are sold by special order to the public," said Shimamura. "People can call and order any cuts of meat they wish. The meats from our lab are in high demand."

"Hands on experience is a must in our department," said Shimamura. "Our major does not require internships by the students so it is very advantageous to have the experience of working in an actual processing lab."

From the looks of the food processing lab and its club's activities, a "hands on experience" is exactly what Cal Poly's food science students are getting. At the same time they are providing a valuable service to the campus and the community.

## Scientist opens seminar

A five-lecture seminar on the evolution of species will begin at Cal Poly on Thursday, April 14, with an address by a University of California, Davis, emeritus professor of genetics.

G. Ledyard Stebbins will discuss "New Light on the Problem of Species" at 11 a.m. in the Science building Room E-27. Admission will be free.

The UC geneticist was awarded the National Medal of Science in 1979

for his contributions to plant evolution theory, and has written several books on the subject.

Stebbins also will speak to the Cal Poly chapter of Sigma Xi, a national scientific research society, on the subject of "Biological Evolution, Cultural Evolution, and the Position of Sociobiology." That address, also April 14 and open to the public, is scheduled for 7:30 p.m. in Science Room B-5.

## Jumper takes top-athlete title at Fresno; seven more NCAA qualifying marks set

Janet Yarbrough literally leaped into the spotlight at the Fresno Bee Track and Field Invitational Satur-

day at Fresno State University.

The senior from Clovis popped a seasonal best of 20-7 in the long jump to win the event, surpass the Division I national qualifying standard, miss her school record by one inch, and, coupled with a win in the 100-meter hurdles, win the female athlete-of-the-meet honors.

Yarbrough led a 1-2-3 Mustang sweep in the 100 hurdles as Cal Poly simply had a (track and) field day in Fresno. Yarbrough clocked a 13.90, while Cece Chandler set a seasonal

best 14.39 and Kathy Reimann ran a 14.94.

Also having field days for Poly were senior Dana Henderson and sophomore Kathy Kahn. The duo re-established their school records set earlier this season. Henderson started the day with a 44-8 1/4 toss in the shot-put, breaking her seven-week-old standard of 44-4. She placed fourth in the event. Kahn surpassed her 145-7 three-week-old mark with a 150-5 throw as she won the discus event.

On the day, the Mustangs set seven more

Division II national qualifying marks to give them 51 by 27 athletes. Heading the list is senior Arleen Van Warmerdam. She ran qualifying and personal marks in the 100 (12.06) and 200 (24.37) and has now qualified in five events (100, 200, 400, 4x100 relay). Tamela Holland also qualified in the 200 (24.25) to give her four events.

Also with four events is distance standout Amy Harper. Running her first competitive 800 this season, she set a personal

## Trip home turns into bad trip as baggers drop three games

After suffering through its own version of "Lost Weekend," the Cal Poly baseball team couldn't afford to take a rest.

"We're not taking tomorrow off," said Mustangs' head coach Berdy Harr Saturday moments after visiting Cal Poly Pomona had captured both ends of a double-header to complete a three-game series sweep. "Tomorrow's Sunday," he reminded.

The Mustangs, who opened California Collegiate Athletic Association play with four wins in five games on the road, are now in the midst of a four-game losing streak and mired in fourth place with a 5-5 record. The Broncos, with four wins this week, including one over league-leading UC Riverside, are now 5-3.

Coming off a 5-2 setback Friday night, the Mustangs forged ahead in each of Saturday's contests, taking a 2-1 lead into the fifth inning of the first game and holding a 3-1 advantage in the sixth inning of the seven-inning nightcap. But in both cases, weak Mustang pitching allowed the Broncos to overtake the hosts, as Pomona won game one 9-3

before wrapping up the second game in extra-innings, 6-3.

"Their hitters were able to lay back and dig in," Harr complained. The Mustang hitters had no such luxury, according to Harr, who praised Broncos' pitchers Steve Ziem and Steve Gomez, each of whom tossed complete-game victories.

"Pomona did a good job pitching. They were able to keep our hitters off stride most of the time."

Ziem was particularly impressive, fanning 10 Mustangs while scattering six hits. This was the same Ziem who the Mustangs pounded in their CCAA opening 12-2 win in Pomona.

"Apparently he had better stuff (today)," said Harr, confirming the obvious.

Down 2-1 in the fifth, the Broncos tied game one with some daring base-running. Bronco center fielder Scott Foscaldo, who had doubled and advanced to third on an out, darted for home with two out and slid under catcher Pat Esposito's tag, who had received Mike Briare's low and outside pitch.

Pomona pushed two more runs across in the sixth to take a 4-2 lead and then slammed the door on the Mustangs with four

runs in the seventh—all coming on one swing.

In that inning, Mustang junior left-hander Dave Hampton relieved loser Briare with two on, one out, and a two-ball count to hitter Tom Scaletta. In the next three pitches, the ballgame would be over.

Hampton promptly wild-pitched the runners to second and third, then tossed ball four to Scaletta to load the bases. Bronco left fielder Jim Torchia then lifted Hampton's first offering over the 333 foot mark on the left field fence for a grand-slam homer and a 8-2 lead.

Part of the Mustangs downfall Saturday could be found in the lack of output by the three, four, and five hitters in the order. Monty Waltz, Steve Neel, and Kirk Perry were a combined 2 for 21 in the twinbill.

Meanwhile Jeff Estabrook and Rob Lambert, the Mustang's one and two hitters in the lineup, who managed only one hit between them in 10 at-bats for the first game, more than made up for that non-productivity in the second contest, stroking seven singles in eight trips. The Mustangs scored single runs in each of the first three frames and Estabrook and Lambert both helped in two of them.

Estabrook led off the

home half of the first with a single and quickly moved to third on Lambert's safety, from where he scored on a passed ball. In the third, the duo's attempted double-steal was thwarted when Estabrook was gunned down at third, but Lambert came around to score from second on Neel's two-out triple.

Carrying a 3-1 lead into the sixth, starter Pete Spiliotis lost it when Pomona designated hitter launched a two-run homer.

In the extra frame, the Broncos made reliever Scott Bakker a loser when Ron Johns belted a lead-off triple and scored on Adrian Valdivia's medium fly to right.

The Mustangs travel to Orange County Tuesday to try one more time against these Broncos and then return to San Luis Obispo Stadium for a Wednesday afternoon game with Cal State Northridge at 2:30.
