Documentary ‘The Prosecutor’ To Show at Cal Poly Feb. 15

Professors to Hold Panel Discussion

SAN LUIS OBISPO – “The Prosecutor,” a documentary that follows the work of Luis Moreno-Ocampo, chief prosecutor of the International Criminal Court, will screen at 6 p.m. Wednesday, Feb. 15, in Room 220 in the University Union at Cal Poly.

Moreno-Ocampo investigates and prosecutes some of the world's most notorious criminals for some of the world's worst crimes. Most notably, he issued an arrest warrant for Sudan President Omar Al Bashir for crimes against humanity, war crimes and genocide.

The documentary provides a rare glimpse into the controversial work of Moreno-Ocampo. It follows him through the first trials of the newly formed International Criminal Court in The Hague and offers a front-row seat to the historic events that might determine whether the International Criminal Court is a groundbreaking new weapon for global justice or an idealistic dream.

Before the documentary is shown, a reception with pizza and beverages will be held. After the documentary, which runs about 90 minutes, Craig Arceneaux, Cal Poly Political Science Department chair, will join a panel of professors in a brief discussion.
