High School Students Exploring Architecture Career During Summer Workshop at Cal Poly

SAN LUIS OBISPO – High school students interested in architecture as a career are showcasing their projects after completing a four-week architecture summer career workshop organized by Cal Poly's College of Architecture and Environmental Design.

The students' sketches, computer animations and physical models can be viewed from 10 a.m. to noon Friday, July 20, in Room 105 in the Architecture and Environmental Building (No. 5) on campus.

The career workshop, taught by faculty from the college, includes 72 participants from across the country taking part in an in-depth view of the profession through hands-on experiences in architecture design, building science, structural engineering and site planning.

The College of Architecture and Environmental Design's Summer Career Workshop typically takes place mid-June through mid-July and is open to high school students from across the county on a first sign-up basis.

The workshop includes career and education advising to assist with the decision-making process as students prepare to apply for college. Participants are also introduced to campus life and stay in the university's residence halls for the full four weeks.
