Cal Poly's Another Type of Groove Celebrates Women's HERstory Month with Simply Kat on March 5

SAN LUIS OBISPO — The Cal Poly MultiCultural Center's "Another Type of Groove: Spoken Word Poetry" celebrates Women's HERstory Month with poet Simply Kat at 7:30 p.m. on Wednesday, March 5 in Chumash Auditorium in the University Union on campus.

HBO Def Poet Simply Kat pushes the boundaries of spoken word. She is a national performance poet, grand slam champion, and author and co-founder of Say Word, a premier spoken word organization working with youth in Los Angeles.

She is a mother and an artist who has performed around the nation, captivating audiences with her powerful and distinct voice and sharing her story with unyielding vulnerability and passion. She has performed with such musical talents as Grammy winner Ryan Lesli, hip-hop legend Mos Def, singer/songwriter Raheem Devaughn, and Latin Grammy winner Ozomatli.

Another Type of Groove is a spoken-word poetry event held the first Wednesday of every month throughout the school year at Cal Poly. Each event includes a feature poet and an open mic opportunity for interested community members and students. The event is free and open to the public.

The MultiCultural Center cultivates a campuswide community that represents and celebrates the diversity of Cal Poly's student body. The center empowers students to grow beyond their personal barriers, strengthen their understanding of diversity and social responsibility, and develop leadership skills while fostering a sense of belonging.
