Teacher, Pat Ariaz gave a report about current shop and Ag. Mechanics projects that will be exhibited at the county fair.

Ed Hoogeveen, member of advisory committee, asked if he may remain on the committee after his son graduated high school. We welcomed his concern and accepted him to remain on the committee.

Pat Ariaz reported that the grant that Amanda Gardner had worked on for the "concession trailer" had been turned down by the State. Funding was low this year for the grants, so we will reapply next time.

Present

Comments

Roger Thompson asked if he could get some pictures of the students at the new School Farm.

Pat Ariaz said he approached JM equipment as they are in dire need of a forklift. They would like a diesel. They may be able to help with the program. We would work out a deal where we would paint their equipment in return for the equipment.

Ryan Costa reported that Pat Ariaz tendered his resignation effective at the end of this school year.

Chicken Project

Jason Messer informed that the old sheep barn had been converted into a chicken castle. Eight students are currently involved with the chicken project. The students have to be in FFA. Brahmas are being raised. The coop has just been finished. Jason took on this project early in the year. He said he is realizing that the teachers do a lot of work.

Construction Update

Ryan said we have a timeline for the shop equipment and he ran down the latest updates to the new School Farm as follows:

- They are waiting for Airgas to fulfill the rest of their obligations. No support from Airgas has been received as of yet.
- The hog barn equipment is being installed. The goat and sheep barn are next in line to be done. Kim Ketchum is installing the equipment for the barns. The beef barn will be last.
- The greenhouse is still out for bid. We have collected three bids. We have \$51,000 allocated and two came in at \$98,000. The last one came in at \$52,000. Michael Garr said we should have a fully functioning greenhouse by the end of the summer.
- The paint booth will be done in the next 4 – 6 weeks. We are just waiting on the permits.
- Pig feeders are here.
- The electrician has finished up the hog barn.
- Vet. Tech class will hopefully come to the farm for 2012-13. Ag Shop, Entrepreneurship and Farm Skills will all be held out at the school farm next year, along with an ROP Administration of Justice course.

High School Updates

- Weston Ranch – Amanda Koslow reported that they just got a metal bender and are getting custom orders from the community. They are working on the school garden and just got a bid for the fences. They have all the wood for the raised flower boxes. Next year, they will be working on shading. Farm days are coming. At a fundraiser, they won a welder. John Hopper added that their group had a first and third place in the state when they were in Arbuckle in the Ag Mechanics division. Additionally, the Ag Mechanics team is going to Merced College so they are earning credits at night. They are collecting

soda pop tabs for recycling, doing a cookie dough fundraiser, working on their greenhouse, and working on a plant sale.

- Manteca High – Tristyn Silva informed that Mark Chaffin has a horticulture class that is coming along nicely. They are redoing their greenhouse and working on the shading. Their banquet is coming in April. Floriculture has been approached to do flower arrangements and some of the elementary schools are getting flowers from them for their dances.
- Lathrop – Jaime Sanchez said they are doing a lot of community service work. They partnered with the Lions Club and are working with the speech competition. They will be starting a new project. Right before the fair, they will be going to Kentucky to get trained.
- Sierra – Amanda Gardner stated that one of their 9th graders qualified for the public speaking contest. They are also focusing on community service and are doing a campus beautification project, along with a drive-through BBQ fundraiser. Their greenhouse is in full production. They are getting prepared for the fair. Veggies will be submitted, along with various animals.

Farm Projects

- Veggie Express is doing very well other than this last month due to the weather. Ryan said he had to shut it down for 3-4 weeks. He was down to 6 student workers and they had been making about \$25/hour for their consistent work (4-5 hours a week after school). One of the students built an orchard float which made about \$1600. Veggie Express has paid about \$3500 to MUSD for the loan they received to start the project.
- Rabbits – Dani Ariaz said they went to a rabbit seminar on February 19 and on February 26 they went to a rabbit show. They have been pretty busy with the rabbits. The students are not making much money raising their rabbits. They work all year and only make about \$50. Pat said they should start a booster club.
- Pheasants – John Hopper said that Thunderhill bought about 100 of their pheasants and they will have another batch coming in May.
- Montadale Project – Jaime Sanchez reported that they are currently weaning all the lambs off of the ewes and are gearing up for the Nationals. They will go back to Missouri this summer and will be taking 5 students with them. They will be selling some of the animals, which will pay for part of the trip. Pat revealed that the Montadale Association partnered with our district about 17 years ago. He believes they will win a national championship this year. It is the biggest show in the U.S.

IBGA Goat Show

Pat declared that the IBGA Goat Show will be held at the new School Farm for the first time this year and they will train people on how to judge goats. It will be hosted by MUSD and Friends of the Montadales. They will do all the concessions, which will help raise money for students to take a trip. They will put on a showmanship and will be doing carcass evaluations. Tracy H.S. will buy all the carcasses to make jerky. Agencies from all over will be coming to this event. Jaime is taking all the entries. This will be the first time this show has ever been done at a high school.

Planet Party

Tristyn Silva disclosed that last year was our first Planet Party. They discuss Ag conservation and teach sixth graders how to be environmentally conscientious at the Planet Party. Tristyn is the co-chair of this annual event, and she is looking for presenters and exhibitors for this student field trip. If anyone is interested, they need to contact her for more information. This will take place on May 5, 2011 at the District Office in the transportation area.
