### Poly Team Takes Second at International Drone-Building Competition

An international roster of engineering schools competed to build the best drone at the 22nd annual American Society of Mechanical Engineers (ASME) Student Design Competition, held at the International Mechanical Engineering Congress & Exhibition at Montreal's Palais des Congrès. Competing against topflight teams from China, France, India, Peru, Turkey and the U.S., the Cal Poly contingent took second place in



the effort to build a powerful, maneuverable, remotely piloted drone that could navigate obstacles, complete a targeted payload drop, and return to the start in one piece. ### Center for Community Engagement Hosts Annual Gift Drive Through Dec. 3



The Department of Wellbeing, Health & Counseling Services is offering three trainings to educate the campus community about how to respond to a mental health crisis.

— Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) will teach attendees how to recognize the signs of addiction and mental illnesses, implement a five-step action plan to assess a situation and provide help, understand the impact of mental and substance use disorders, and identify local resources. MHFA will be offered from noon to 5 p.m. Monday, Dec. 1, and Tuesday, Dec. 2. A second training will be offered from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. Monday, Dec. 8, and Tuesday, Dec. 9.

— Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST) is an intensive, interactive and practice-dominated course designed to help people recognize risk and learn how to intervene to prevent the immediate risk of suicide. ASIST will be offered from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Thursday, Dec. 4, and Friday, Dec. 5. Reservations are required. Attendees must attend both sessions of each respective training. 
